He had a great sense of humor, was a Corvette enthusiast and was a key member of the LCCC family. I stress 'family' because of what Mary Anne has shared with us, that this club is in a sense, an extension of family. Scott will be greatly missed. Please keep Mary Anne in your thoughts and prayers.

As previously stated in an e-mail blast, there will be a service for Scott at the Ephrata Community Church on Saturday, July 8th. Visitation will be from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM followed by a service from 11:00 AM to Noon.

On Friday, we only managed to sell 9 tickets. On Saturday, we did a bit better and sold 45. This totals 54 tickets sold which is less than half the total we would normally expect.

Additionally, the car did not arrive in time and without it, we didn't have the kind of draw we would expect. Fortunately, a member of the Chip Miller Foundation Board loaned us his white C8 on Saturday.

You know what this means, we need everyone to ramp up their efforts to get the tickets sold. The current total is below.

We currently have 626 tickets either sold or distributed for sale. That number is spread among 34 members or club sponsors.

Scott's C5Z

I was getting frustrated trying to make a heavily modified SUV do car things. I wanted a competitive Autocross car again. I was looking for a C5 Fixed Roof Coupe when I saw a comparatively priced high mileage Z06 on E-bay in Wichita Kansas. It was Electron Blue with 130k miles.

My dad and I flew out and drove it back to Pa. That was a fun road trip. We took turns driving, and the passenger read the owner's manual. I did some basic suspension upgrades and ran that car for 3 years.

I did heads, cam, and a quick refresh on the LS6 at 155K and ran it for another 2 years. I ran almost all the LCCC Autocrosses and a bunch of SCCA events.

I ran the car 5 years on One Lap of America. Jim Roberts and I shared the driving in 2009 and 2010, finishing 15th and 26th overall. I drove all the competitive events in 2011-2013 with Nick Young as my transit driver. We finished 13th overall in 2011 & 2012 and 19th overall in 2013.

I sold the C5Z at 177K to a local father and son who took it wheel to wheel racing. I was itching for a car that would fit more tire, and started looking at Widebody C6's. But the C6 is a longer story.

LCCC Caravan to NCM

Road Trip 2023

On June 5th, fourteen club members joined Scott and Mary Anne Lewandowski in a caravan to Bowling Green, KY. Due to an unfortunate accident following the Memorial Day parade in Marietta, Joe and Barb Schuller were forced to take her Toyota Prius. This would produce some humor along the way.

DAY 1: Upon arriving at Whitmoyer Buick-Chevrolet, participating members were given a tote bag from Scott and Mary Anne that included a printed guide, gifts from Whitmoyer, snacks and a personalized chip clip that Mary Anne made on her Cricut printer.

After picking two cards for the first day's poker run, the group headed out to the Pennsylvania Turnpike. We made our first rest stop at the Sideling Hill Service Area where we picked our third card on the poker run. Shortly after crossing into Maryland, we had lunch at The Casselman Inn in Grantsville, MD. At this stop we picked our fourth card.

Following lunch, it was back on the road and heading to West Virginia. At the Burnsville, WV rest area, we picked our fifth card and had an introduction to geocaching. For the uninitiated, geocaching is (according to Dr. Google): *an outdoor recreational activity, in which participants use a Global Positioning System receiver or mobile device and other navigational techniques to hide and seek containers, called "geocaches" or "caches", at specific locations marked by coordinates all over the world.*

Scott and Mary Anne lead us to a corner of the grassy area away from the noise of the highway where we were shown a 'bird house' that wasn't a bird house. Inside were trinkets and a logbook of who stopped and when. The contents are then returned to the safety of the 'bird house' for the next explorer to find.

We ended our day by pulling into our hotels in Cross Lanes, WV with a group meal at the adjacent Cracker Barrel. The winner of the poker run was Ed Sumpman who was presented an impressive trophy by Mary Anne.

DAY 2: After picking our first two cards for another poker run the group headed for Kentucky. Our next stop and card selection was at the Morehead, KY rest area. Onward towards Lexington where we would pick up the Blue Grass Parkway.

This route proved to be an area of almost non-stop beautiful city/country mix with many equestrian estates and bourbon distillers (no, we didn't stop). Our next stop was in Bardstown, KY for a lunch stop. This would also be our last card pick for the day two poker run.

Following lunch, we headed to Bowling Green. Once there, it was a quick stop at the museum where we grabbed a group picture and looked through the Corvette store. After checking into our hotels, we gathered for a group meal at the Montana Grill where Jim Roberts was presented with a trophy for winning the second day poker run.

DAY 3: Our group arrived at the GM Corvette Assembly Plant (parking lot B) for our tour around mid-morning. There we split into two groups and proceeded to explore the birthplace of new Corvettes. As is standard practice with all major corporations, no photography was allowed inside the plant. What we did see was a well-run operation cranking out 92 cars a day, on average. We saw several Z06s and several E-Rays being built. In short, it was extremely impressive. If you haven't been here, it should be on your bucket list.

As we prepared to move over to the National Corvette Museum, Joe found a parking ticket on their Prius. It turns out that only GM vehicles are allowed in the lot we parked in. This would lead to some good-natured jabs at Joe for getting the only ticket on the trip.

At the museum, the group enjoyed roaming through the displays where we scattered like kids at the playground. This was followed by lunch at the Stingray Grill inside the museum. After lunch we gathered in a meeting to listen to a few presentations by museum staff. After, the group presented the toy cars (Hot Wheels, Matchbox, etc.) that Scott and Mary Anne have been collecting.

Closing out the day at the museum was a surprise autocross event for everyone to participate in. This was held inside the museum as the car was a remote-controlled scale model Corvette that had to be 'driven' around miniature cones. The winner of the final trophy was yours truly. That evening, no group dinner was planned but most of the group gathered at Raffety's.

DAY 4: In the morning, the group gathered at the NCM Motorsports Park to have a look around, hear about the facility and take a few 'parade' laps. Most tracks specify that 'parade' laps are held at a speed similar to what you would experience on a public highway. It turned out these were not exactly typical parade laps as we got to stretch the Corvette's 'legs' a bit more than expected. Naturally, this surprised some passengers even more than the drivers. Big fun however!

That afternoon we were on our own as there were numerous things to check out in the Bowling Green area and Scott and Mary Anne provided a lot of sources for us to explore. The week we were there was Duncan Hines Days, an annual celebration of the Bowling Green native who was a pioneer of restaurant ratings for travelers. He later licensed his name to be used on the cake mixes we all know.

Some of our group had to leave early so a smaller group of us visited the Aviation Heritage Park where we saw a small but interesting group of military aircraft. Later that afternoon we gathered in downtown Bowling Green for a vintage car show and parade as part of the Duncan Hines celebrations.

DAY 5: For our last day in town, our group decided to visit the Lost River Cave and take their tour. This is a fascinating attraction with a colorful history. The cave's history includes a pre-Civil War mill, a Civil War era camp, a Jesse James hide-out and a nightclub following the repeal of Prohibition. Tours are by flat-bottom boats that require the riders to bend down to clear the entrance but then the ceiling opens to 60 feet of head space.

Late in the afternoon, we took in a minor league baseball game between the Winston-Salem Dash and the Bowling Green Hot Rods. A very similar experience to our Lancaster Barnstormers, we enjoyed a night of good baseball under the lights. As it was Duncan Hines Days, we all received a most unique give-away at the ballpark entrance – a Duncan Hines cake mix!

Bowling Green is more than just our favorite museum and birthplace of Corvettes. It is a very nice place to be.

DAY 6 & 7: On Saturday, it was time to head home where our smaller group back traced our route through Kentucky and into West Virginia. On Sunday, as we headed east on the Pennsylvania Turnpike, we encountered our only real traffic issue (aside from spotty construction areas). An incident between the Kittatinny and Blue Mountain tunnels stopped all east bound traffic for about a half hour.

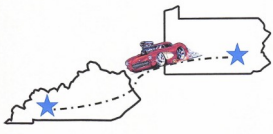
