I was drawn to this particular day because they scheduled a Salon event where designers Gordon Buehrig, Raymond Loewy, Harley Earl, Bill Mitchell, Virgil Exner and Dick Teague were discussed. They had five special cars on center display that related to many of the designers: a 1935 Auburn 851 Boattail Speedster, a 1937 Cord 812 Supercharged, a 1949 Cadillac Series 62 Sedanette, a 1953 Studebaker Commander Coupe and a 1966 Corvette Stingray convertible with a 427/425 big block. All were exceptional and to history buffs, all represent milestones.

All were original with some only having minimal restoration. Some of you know I am a big Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg fan. The 851 Speedster is something incredibly special and my all-time favorite. Yes, of course, the '66 Stingray was very nice too.

While the destination would have been appropriate to take the Corvette, the weather made the decision a no-brainer. Philadelphia set a single-day rainfall record with 3.09 inches of rain. We took the Equinox.

As I said, there are limitations but also common sense must prevail. On the way there we encountered a few places that had surface flooding likely due to blocked storm drains. Upon leaving, one street around the Foundation was impassable. Regardless, we enjoyed the day and highly recommend a visit if you have not been there before.

Q: When did you join LCCC?

A: Scott and I joined in 1993, shortly after we bought our 1980 Dark Green Metallic Corvette. I still have that car!

Q: How did you learn about the club and how did you join it?

A: I worked with John Zimmerman at New Holland in the late '80s. He and his wife, Dee, were long-time members of the club with their '63 convertible. The first time we met with the club was on the lawn at WGAL TV station when they were taking the photo for the club's 25th anniversary!

Q: What do you enjoy the most about being a member of LCCC?

A: I love the camaraderie. This club has made me feel loved and accepted through the good times and the challenging ones. LCCC is an extension of my family and I treasure and appreciate that beyond words.

Q: Which Corvette is your favorite and why?

A: I like them all, but my favorite would have to be whichever one I'm sitting in at the moment.

Q: Tell us about one time (event or get-together) with the club that has a special place in your memories.

A: That's easy. My favorite club event is the 2023 Caravan to Bowling Green. It was so much fun spending time with the club members who joined Scott and me. We were thrilled that the club trusted us with putting that trip together and leading it. Getting to know each person better, sharing the laughter and good times, while sharing the National Corvette Museum with the group, was wonderful. It was especially important to me that folks got to know Scott better – since he was never the loud one (!) - it took a little longer to get to know what kind of person he was. This trip was a great chance for that to happen. We both had such a good time on that trip. That memory is especially sweet now.

Q: Do you have a favorite 'Corvette memory' and what is it?

A: Scott and I bought out first Corvette in 1988. It was a 1963 convertible...project car. It was in about a million pieces. There were no nuts or bolts left to remove. We had car parts everywhere in the house! My favorite memory, though, was when we realized that it was going to be a LONG time before we would be able to drive our Corvette. We put the seats in the car (just sat them in there), we sat an oscillating fan where the hood should have been and turned it on and sat in the seats – so we could imagine what it would be like to ride down the road and feel the wind blowing through our hair! :-)

If you're wondering, we sold it before it was finished because it was more than we could handle. It was, however, a great learning experience and gave us our first lessons in the Corvette hobby. Those experiences kept us coming back year after year.

Q: Where have you visited with the club, are there any favorites and what was special about those trips?

A: We've been to Ocean City, MD, Natural Bridge/Skyline Drive, Bowling Green, KY and some local venues (like ice cream shops, car shows, and Leisure Lanes). I really enjoy going on trips with the club because it always gives me an opportunity to get to know folks better.

For many years, the club would rent a few lanes at Leisure Lanes on New Years' Eve, and we would bring food and bowl all night, go out for breakfast around 5am, and then go home and sleep! It was a lot of fun.

Q: What is your vision of this club in the future?

A: I'm encouraged to see more young people join the club and get involved. My vision for the future of

I am on the right and Gary "Duck" Drake, my Transit Driver is on the left. We will be using my new 2023 Orange Z51 Corvette this year. Joe Yacobenas will be my Transit Driver this year to help with the highway miles.

I am getting ready for this years event in which we will compete in early May. Every year we do a different route, this year we will be leaving from South Bend after the Wet Skid Pad Competition and then head to Hastings Motorsports Park in Nebraska, then on to High Plains Raceway near Denver in Colorado. The next day we will turn back to the east and run at the new Hedge Hollow Road Course in Missouri then off to the NCM Motorsports Park in Bowling Green Kentucky where we will also run an Autocross. We will then head north to Pittsburgh International Race Complex and run the Full Course, later that day we will cross the border into Ohio and do two Drag Strip events. For Friday we will be running at Putnam Park in southern Indiana and then back to South Bend where our last event on Saturday will be the Dry Skid Pad Competition. With the miles to South Bend and back home, the total will be almost 5,000 miles in about 9 days.

Joe Yacobenas will be my Transit Driver, helping with the highway miles, and I will do all the competition driving. Joe is a former member of LCCC and is my Crew Chief to my racing. This will be my 15th One Lap and for the last several years we have raised over Forty eight Thousand dollars for the Pa. Breast Cancer Coalition over the years. 

Passengers are allowed in vehicles ONLY with the event chairperson's permission. If they are not participating in the event and are age 12 or older.
