Secretary's Report

There was no questions or corrections of the minutes as presented in the Members' Only section of the Club website- motion was made by Brad Marley to accept, seconded by Mary Ann Lewandowski. All in favor, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Carl's asked if there were questions or corrections to the Treasurer's Report as presented in the Members' Only section of the Club website. Motion was made to accept by Joe Schuller, seconded by Ken Unger. All in favor, motion passed.

General Meeting and Executive Board Summary

General Meeting—May 10, 2023

Meeting called to order by Kurt Steidle at 7:30 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Governor's Report—Clyde Mooney

On Saturday, May 20th the second 2023 East Region Governor's Meeting was held at the Holiday Inn, Grantville, PA. In conjunction with the governor's meeting, the East Regions annual car show was held in the hotel parking lot, while the meeting was taking place.

The meeting was called to order promptly at 10:00 AM. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Alliance followed by the playing of the National Anthem. With the show being held at the same time Andy Alleshouse, Regional Executive, emphasis the need to keep to the agenda.

Both the minutes and treasurer's reports were presented by Michele Cantelmo and Valerie Cifuni respectively, there were no comments or corrections, motions were made to approve both, and both were passed.

Scott Fredericks provided a recap of NCCC membership for the East Region as well as nationally. At the March meeting the East Region had 1,908 members and has added 70 either late renewal or new members bringing the regions current membership to 1,978. At the same meeting the national membership was 17,485 and today stands at 18,241 an increase of 756. LCCC with 121 members ranks seventh in the East Region with Cumberland Valley Corvette Club first with 218 members.

Andrej Blanc- East Region Competition Director, stressed that the only waiver forms that are acceptable for use, are those currently available on the NCCC website. Each participant and/or worker must sign the waiver in person. Signing the waiver for someone else is not allowed. It was noted that the liability insurance coverage has increased from 5 million to unlimited. We were asked to please make an effort not to test this.

Total electric vehicles are not allowed to attend any NCCC club competition (sanctioned or non-sanctioned) events. The reason for this rule is most fire departments do not have adequate methods of extinguishing a large battery vehicle fire leading to the possibility of extensive fire damage to the surrounding area that our insurance would be responsible to fix. That said, with the introduction of the E-Ray Corvette and the push back that

followed NCCC has decided that hybrid (petroleum / electric) vehicles are allowed to compete in all NCCC events because the batteries in hybrids are much smaller, therefore easier to extinguish.

Scott and Mary Anne Lewandowski presented the NCM Ambassadors report. I am sure they will make the videos from the Bash available to our members and I would encourage you to view. They are excellent.

With no further business to discuss a motion was made to adjourn and easily passed. As soon as the meeting was over the results of the show were presented plus the awards from the 2022 competition season were passed out. Sharon Roberts was third in worker points, and Sue and I were recognized as having placed seventh in overall points. Our club won the award for having the largest number of show entrants. Our members in attendance were: Henry & Valerie Cifuni, Carl & Valerie Lally, Tony and Lisa DeFelice, Scott & Mary Anne Lewandowski, Kurt and Joan Steidle, Sue & myself. I sure hope I did not forget anyone. I will say it was great to have other club members in attendance and to win out over the Bel Air Corvette Club. Hope we have the same result at the upcoming Perry County Corvette Club Show.

Steve Johnson Racing is in its 37th season of competition in the NHRA's Pro Stock Motorcycle class. The team has claimed 11 NHRA Wallys, including a win at the prestigious U.S. Nationals in Indianapolis. Over the course of his career, Steve has competed in over 450 NHRA events and 750 rounds of racing. In the 2022 season, Team SJR claimed 2 event wins, in Houston and Charlotte, and a runner-up finish in Richmond. In Charlotte, they set the track record for Pro Stock Motorcycle with a 6.712 ET, and in Houston, they posted Steve's career best run with a 6.711 ET at 201.55 mph. 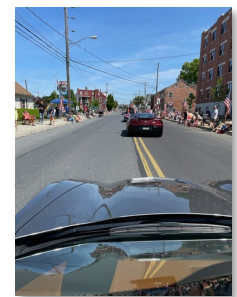

A Quick Recap of my One Lap of America 2023



Our 2023 One Lap of America is complete and in the books. I had a tremendous start to the week on Saturday in the Wet Skid Pad Competition, finishing 7th overall out of 84 competitors, and 2nd in class, in

that event. The really neat thing is that I was the fastest American Brand car since the top 6 were all German cars with the first place being a Porsche GT3. After the Wet Skid Pad we went 83 miles south to Grissom Air Force Base and did an Autocross event on the Runways. After the Autocross we then went 311 miles northeast to near Youngstown, Ohio where we would compete at Nelson Ledges Race Track the next day.

At each Road Course Track we do a morning and an afternoon event and when complete, usually by 2:30 or 3:00 pm we then head to the hotel near the next track. After completing the event at Nelson Ledges we had a more than 700 mile transit to our hotel near Road Atlanta Grand Prix Course getting in about 1:30am. After the events at Road Atlanta we then had a short 274 mile commute to Nashville Superspeedway Roval, near Nashville Tennessee. After finishing up at Nashville we had another over 700 mile transit to Texas where we stayed the night with Jeff & Kelly Murphy. We ran on Eagles Canyon Raceway, Italian Canyon Course on Wednesday, then headed to Hallett Motor Racing Circuit only 252 miles north in Oklahoma where I had one of my better events of the week on Thursday.

Our transit after Hallett in Oklahoma was over 700 miles east to (National Corvette Museum) NCM Motorsports Park Road Course where it rained for the morning event and I had my best road course event of the week. After finishing up at NCM on Friday we then headed only 373 miles north back to South Bend where we would do our final event Saturday morning, the Dry Skid Pad event where I did well becoming my 3rd best event of the week. After the Dry Skid Pad competition they wrapped up the week with the Awards Banquet. My transit home was just over 600 miles and including my miles from home to South Bend & to home after the finish plus the event transits and miles on the tracks I totaled 5,037 miles in

just a little over a week.

Gary "Duck" Drake, a friend from Cincinnati was my transit driver for 4 years now and our diet for the week was some of the finest foods available at fast food restaurants and Gas Stations. 😊 My biggest success of the year was raising over \$4,800 dollars for the Pa. Breast Cancer Coalition and now over \$45,000 over the years. A BIG Thank You to the members of the Lancaster County Corvette Club for their generous help in my fundraising effort.

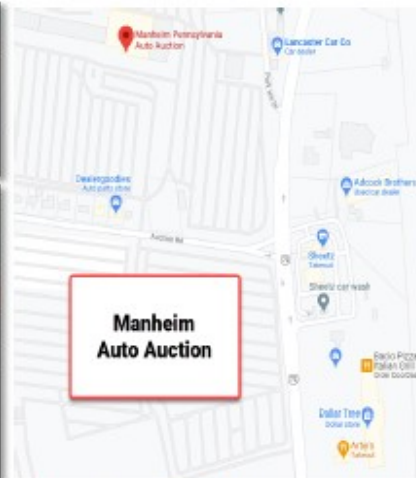

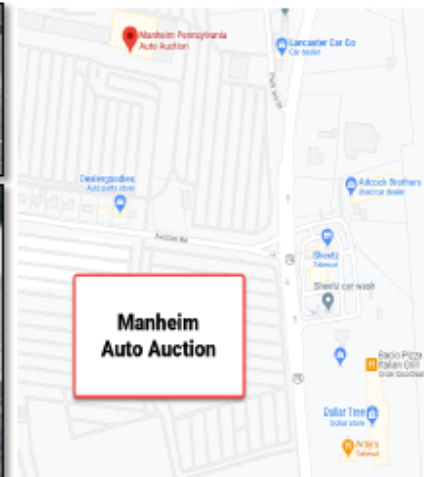

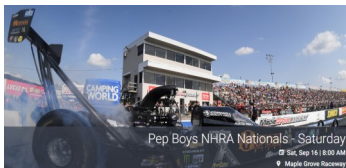

This installment of Ambassador News should bring some interesting highlights to you regarding happenings at the National Corvette Museum. First up is the NCM Bash Event that took place at the end of April. This is always a great event to attend because it is the preview of what is coming up in the new model year for Corvette. This year was everything E-Ray. Many cars to see in all different colors including the reveal of 3 new colors for 2024. During the event, we heard from Tadge Juechter (Exec. Chief Engineer), Harlan Charles (Marketing Director) and the unsung hero of the seminars this year was a presentation by Cody Bulkley (Corvette Engineer) and his enthusiastic presentation of the Corvette E-Ray stunt at Rockefeller Center in New York City. Cody explains how he accidentally got the E-ray to spin on its center axis and thus coined the term "Cyclone". The logistics to make this event happen were truly incredible! One thing that Cody mentioned was that he started working on the E-ray project in 2015. Yes, that's right, 2nd year of the C7 launch and he was involved in the 3rd model of the C8. We have included the links to these seminars at the end of our note.

During Kai's presentation, he revealed that he is retiring from his job as Plant Manager of the Bowling Green Assembly plant as of June 1st and will turn the reins over to Raymond Theriault. Kai's leadership through the Covid pandemic was truly a miraculous feat.



The McMichael Family Education Gallery was also dedicated during the Bash with a pre-opening gala to all Lifetime and Spire Society Museum members. This children's center will allow the creative minds of our young future Corvette owners to explore and design things that they would believe the next generation of car owners would like to see.

Video screens are being delivered to the NCM and will be placed in the Spire area to give enthusiasts a more interactive experience as they walk through that area. It can work as a series of individual screens or combined into a full immersive projection.

Bowling Green Assembly Plant:

The plant has had several days in the month of April and May where it had set a new record for daily number of cars built on the 2-shift operation. The 2023 model year is being concluded on September 1st and the first 2024 will begin production on September 5th. The 2023 model year will be one of the highest production totals in Corvette history. Currently the record is 53,807 set back in 1979. The engine build program is currently on hold.

NCM Motorsports Park:

Another windstorm tore off a part of the new roof to the garage area of the MSP. Only 2 bays were affected. Construction continues on the Holley Tower to renovate and rebuild after the devastating tornado last year.
