Each year we need to plan ahead for the coming year and next year is no different.



#### My Next Perfect Car

It was in the summer of '15 that I began my search for my next (perfect) car. By the time that 2015 had rolled around I had been working on my 1968 MGB for 10 years and was tired of lots of work and little play.

It was time for something new! My daily driver was a 2001 Pontiac Firebird (base model). It was a 6-cylinder automatic that ran well, but I wanted more, so my search began.

The first stop in my search took me to Windsor, NY, (a small town close to Binghamton) to drive a Porche Boxter that my brother's friend had for sale. While it was a nice car, it wasn't what I was looking for. I next visited a local car dealer to drive a Honda S2000. It was a great car (how can anyone go wrong with a Honda?), but not the right one. I considered a BMW M3, Ford Mustang and Chevy Camaro. None of them fit the bill. That brought my search to Corvette. Of course, Corvette! I owned a 1972 Stingray with a 454 and loved that car.

Since I was planning on making this next car my daily driver, I needed something dependable. As much as I loved my '72 Stingray, another '72 would be almost 50 years old and not very dependable, so my search went on. I looked at a late C3 and couldn't get behind the idea of buying a car, like a Corvette, with a speedometer that peaked at 85 MPH! I moved on to looking at C4s but didn't care for this model until the end of the production run, so on to the C5.

I was not familiar with this body style, but it was love at first sight. I knew this was the model to buy. While cars come in many colors, maroon is my favorite color. I began searching for maroon C5s. While there is a maroon color every year, it was the 2003, 50th Anniversary Red Corvette that I wanted to buy.

Only 30,000 to 35,000 Corvettes are produced annually. For 2003, all Corvettes were 50th anniversary models. About 11,000 Corvettes were produced in the special color of Anniversary Red. About 7,000 were convertibles and 4,000 were coupes, which is what I wanted. I knew that finding the right car would be a challenge. I soon came across another challenge. I wanted a 6-speed manual transmission. The factory set up was an automatic transmission. Stick shift was an upgrade with only about 30% of the total production run being built with a manual transmission. That meant that only about 1,200 Corvettes were built the way that I wanted my car. How many were left was a mystery.

I searched online with little results. I also looked locally at former club member Lee Jackson's inventory, but he did not have what I was looking for. A car would pop up in Texas, or California or some other western state, but I decided to wait for a local car to appear. I knew (hoped) that one would show up one day.

Then, on a Thursday in early January 2016, one appeared outside Philadelphia. I called the dealer and confirmed that the car was available, but there were two other buyers that were interested in the car. With one, they could not agree on price. The other liked the car, his wife told him to "buy it", but he wanted to sleep on

it. I told the dealer that I could not get there until Saturday afternoon because of another commitment. By then the car would probably be sold, so I figured I would need to keep looking.

I called back on Monday, and the car was still available! On Tuesday afternoon, Diane and I headed to Philadelphia. As we drove there (remember it's January) it began to snow. We arrived at the dealer in the late afternoon, and he had pulled the car in out of the snow. He started the car up and gave me a brief tour and left so that Diane and I could discuss it. I asked her what she thought, and she said, "buy it"!

No further discussion was needed. We went to the office and completed the paperwork, and I gave him a check, and he sold it to me for the price that the other buyer (about \$1,000 less than advertised) had offered but never came back. I had not driven the car yet because it was snowing even more. The dealer said that he would deliver the car to me by the end of the week.

We left with the pink buyer's order and went up the road to the local notary to complete the titling paperwork, pay the taxes and fees and left. We went home with a pink piece of paper and a piece of aluminum with 7 digits on it, the proud owners of a car that we didn't drive and weren't driving home.

As we headed home the snow fall rate increased. Looking back, I am not sure that I could have gotten the car home, under those weather conditions, in one piece.

The next day (Wednesday) the dealer called to tell me that he could not deliver the car on Saturday and would I like it on Thursday. I said sure! It came the next day in an enclosed trailer and not a snowflake on her!

This has been the best car that I have ever owned, and I still enjoy driving it now as much as I did the first day that I took her for a drive.

And the icing on the cake is the many friends that I have made at the Lancaster County Corvette Club. Thanks for making me feel welcome!

EVENT CHAIR: Scott Breneman PHONE # 717-725-1038 GOVERNOR: Clyde Mooney PHONE # 717-898-2766 Eligibility: This event is open to all sports cars and sedans, for persons holding a valid drivers' license. No open exhaust systems are allowed for this event (a street legal exhaust system is required). All drivers and passengers must wear either a Snell SA2015 or M2015 or must have a manufacture date less than ten years old and closed toe shoes. The helmet date limit for this event is: September 18, 2013. All cars will undergo a technical inspection to assure that there are no fluid leaks or plainly visible safety issues. Those with mobility issues will be allowed to use an unpowered mobility vehicle to "walk" the course.

Passengers are allowed in vehicles ONLY with the event chairperson's permission. If they are not participating in the event and are age 12 or older. Anyone under the age of 18 must have a parental form completed and signed at time of participation. If someone violates safety rules they may be expelled from the event. They may not compete in further events, and they would not get a refund.




