### Secretary's Report

Clyde Mooney made a motion to approve the Secretary's Reports as documented by Mary Anne Lewandowski in the Members Only section of the club website. Tony DeFelice seconded. The Secretary's Reports were unanimously approved.

### Treasurer's Report

Carl Lally presented the Treasurer's Reports as posted on the Members Only section. Joe Schuller made a motion to approve. Scott Lewandowski seconded. The Treasurer's Reports were unanimously approved.

## Governor's Report – Clyde Mooney

The fourth and final Governor's Meeting for 2022 was held via ZOOM on Saturday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>. As always, the meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance which is normally followed by participant introductions. However, with everyone remote for this meeting a role call of clubs was conducted.

**Michele Cantelmo** – Secretary reviewed the minutes from the September meeting and since there were no corrections or discussion a motion was made to approve and passed.

Since **Val Cifuni** – Treasurer was not in attendance (on a cruise) Andy Alleshouse- Regional Executive presented the treasurers report as well as the 2023 budget proposal. Motions were made to approve both and passed.

2023 National, Regional, and Convention blackout dates where no National Sanctioned events can be held were presented. These are the weekends of National Governors Meeting and the weekend preceding and following the National Convention and of course the week of the convention.

2023 East Region Governor's Meeting dates are **March 11, May 20, September 23, and December 2**. Sanctioned events are not allowed in our region on those dates. Note: The East Region will hold its car show and awards banquet in conjunction with the May meeting. Hopefully LCCC will be well represented at the show.

Prior to the meeting governors were requested to submit the dates desired for 2023 events. **LCCC had requested June 18<sup>th</sup> for the Stauffers Show and September 24<sup>th</sup> for the American Legends Show.** Good news is that we were successful in obtaining those dates. Will wait to request dates for autocrosses until after SCCA post their event schedule.

**Andrej Blanc** – East Region Competition Director following the discussion of sanction dates reviewed the final results of the 2022 regional competition season. Our club finished third in club points following Bel Air Corvette Club and Perry County Corvette Club. Third is the highest that I can remember our club finishing. Perry County had the top three overall men's winners as well as the top two women's winners. Congratula-

tions to them.

Andrej re-empathized that electric vehicles are not allowed in any sanctioned events: high or low speed, rallye, car shows, etc. For now, this is not an issue at Corvette only events but could be an issue if other vehicles are allowed, such as American Legends.

Miscellaneous items:

- 2023 will once again require both a national and a regional competition database. This means LCCC will still be able to have 14 sanctioned events: 10 national and 4 regional.
- Future Corvette Owners Association is available for children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews under 16 years old for a onetime fee of only \$10.00. The child will receive some neat things periodically from the time they joined until they age out. Application form is on the NCCC homepage.
- Membership cards will be sent in the first quarter.
- NCCC Scholarship program opens on January 1<sup>st</sup> and runs until May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. Complete instructions are on the NCCC homepage.
- We were encouraged to participate in the Families Helping Families program. Again, information is available on the NCCC homepage.
- Our club won the Roger Clancy Humanitarian Award in 2020 and 2022 for our charity efforts. They have changed the rules where there must be at least five years before a club can win again.

With no further business to discuss a motion to adjourn was made and passed.

# 2022 Club Award Nominations

## Five Awards to Be Presented at The Annual Awards Banquet and Dinner Dance in March.

The club's Annual Awards Banquet and Dinner Dance returns at a new location in March. Vice President Rick Evans is working on the banquet details. President Kurt Steidle will be organizing a committee to review nominations for the awards. This year we still have five categories but have revised the title of "Outstanding Couple" to "Outstanding Leader(s)".

The following are the award categories with a description of each:

**LCCC Lifetime Achievement Award**—One person, recognized annually, for the consistently outstanding participation, involvement and contributions to the club throughout their membership tenure. Recognition should be limited to those individuals who have been members for 15 years or more.

**LCCC Outstanding Worker(s)**—Recognition of an individual or couple that consistently 'steps-up' to help in club activities throughout the year. Often they go above and beyond in their efforts.

**LCCC Unsung Hero**—Recognition of an individual member that typically 'flies below the radar', but consistently shows up, [participates and gets involved in a variety of club activities.

**Outstanding Leader(s)**—Recognition for an individual or couple who both actively participate in the club's various activities and events, including taking leadership/organizing roles in a variety of activities or events.

**Outstanding New Member**—Rookie recognition of an individual members who have recently joined the club (since July or the previous year). These new members have jumped in 'headfirst' to participate in activities or events and actively support the club.

### Organizational Designations

# National Corvette Museum News

The National Corvette Museum (NCM) and Bowling Green Assembly are pleased to announce plans to resume plant tours of the only facility in the world where Corvettes are manufactured. Tours will go on sale to the public via the National Corvette Museum's website on Tuesday, November 1, 2022. National Corvette Museum members qualify for early booking access, beginning on Tuesday, October 25, 2022. Tour scheduling will take place at the time of purchase with public tours expected to resume before the end of the year.

In 1981, General Motors moved production of the Chevrolet Corvette from St. Louis, MO to 600 Corvette Drive, Bowling Green, KY. Known as "America's Sports Car," the plant tour allows visitors to watch an icon in the making. The Corvette is the world's longest-running, continuously produced passenger car with more than 1.75 million produced. The GM site consists of 212 acres, and the plant has 1.7 million square feet – equivalent to 39 acres or 29.5 football fields, under roof.

Plant tours were initially suspended in 2017 due to plant enhancements and significant layout changes of the facility. The Covid pandemic further delayed plant tours. "We have been waiting for this day for what feels like an eternity," said Kai Spande, Plant Director for the General Motors Bowling Green Assembly Plant and Board Chairman of the National Corvette Museum. "It's a great point of pride for our workforce to be able to share what it takes to make America's Sports Car. We cannot wait to start welcoming Corvette customers, enthusiasts, and friends back for tours of our plant."
