er museum trips and events. It is nearly impossible to attend one of these NCM events and not come away with a few new friends as well. Our Corvette family keeps growing!

On Thursday morning, those who had signed up, drove to the American Muscle Car Museum in Melbourne, FL. There, we were treated to a wonderful display of 385 mostly very low mileage cars belonging to a private collector. The museum is not open to the public, so we were very grateful to have been granted access. The main museum is in a building that is 500' long and about 180' wide. It was built specifically to house this collection and is powered primarily by 12,000 solar

panels. The gentleman who owns the collection has a complete set of Ford GTs in every color for the 2004-2006 model year!

We spent most of Friday, Saturday, and Sunday at the track. This year, we were able to go into the garage area, watch the teams prepare the cars, and meet the drivers when they were available. It is always a thrill to stand next to a race car when it is running.

Mary Anne was the lucky recipient of a Pit Hot Pass tour that was a giveaway item at the Corvette Corral. This included a guide tour of the pits during one of the secondary races on Friday. It was very exciting to see a race pit stop from less than 5 feet!

We learned from the Michelin reps, who came to the Corral before the start of the 24 Hours, that this would be the coldest Rolex 24 Hours on record. Of course, there were concerns with getting the tires and brakes warm

enough to operate the race cars safely. In addition to Michelin reps, we had the pleasure of visits by the Corvette race drivers, Laura Klauser (GM Sports Car Racing Program Manager), Doug Fehan (Corvette Brand Ambassador), and a few others. The sessions were both informative and interesting.

Prior to the start of the race, we made our way out to pit lane to have an up-close look at the race cars and wish the drivers good luck. It was a massive sea of people and so much fun – and a great way to stay warm! After wandering through the pit lane, we hiked across the front stretch banking to the grandstands and climbed up to upper stands to

find the perfect place to witness the start of the race. Fortunately, we had dressed in several layers and, for the first hour or so of the race, had the benefit of the sun shining on us. As evening came, we found our way back to our car and decided to watch more of the race from the comfort and warmth of our hotel room.

Up bright and early on Sunday, we layered again and headed back to the track to watch the finishing laps of the 24-hour race. Thankfully, the Corvettes were still running – even though they were experiencing some growing pains as they adapted to their new class of racing. The team anticipated that they were not expecting to challenge for the

lead in their class, since there were many differences between the rules that had governed the development of the C8.R and the rules of the class in which they were running for the first time in Daytona. All in all, Corvette Racing came away with lots of new data from which they can learn and improve in the race ahead.

Our MiM weekend came to a close at a nice dinner on Sunday evening. It was good to wrap up with our old and new friends. Our trip home was much more direct and focused than the meandering route on the way south. We were home safely by Tuesday evening. Another great time was in the books!



# National Corvette Museum News

## Grady Davis / Don Yenke Croton Watch

Long before the 8 victories at Le Mans and the 14 Championships won by the factory-based Corvette Racing team, there were only the “privateer” race teams campaigning Corvette. Because of a voluntary ban on racing by GM, it took people like Tommy Morrison, John Greenwood, Tony DeLorenzo, Jerry Thompson, Doug Bergen, Bob Johnson, and others to build Corvette’s reputation as a competitor. Before all of them though, it was the Grady Davis Gulf Oil Racing Corvettes driven by Don Yenke and Dick Thompson, that were making history...

On June 11, 1955, Le Mans became the site of the worst disaster in motorsports history, when a car went off track into the crowd, killing 83 spectators and the driver. In response to this tragedy and a desire to avoid government intervention, GM joined others from the Automobile Manufacturers Association, and agreed to a ban on motorsports activity.

The desire to see and experience sports car racing continued though, so it was then that “privateer” rac-

ers took the wheel. Privateers bought their Corvettes from the dealership with whatever performance options they could get, and then modified them for racing. For teams that did well, they might begin to see “heavy-duty” parts show up from Chevrolet Engineering for “testing” on track.

Grady Davis, Vice President of Gulf Oil, was one such privateer. Using Gulf Oil research and development resources, and some clandestine heavy-duty help

from Chevy engineers, he was able to give his drivers Corvettes that could win.

For drivers, he connected with Chevrolet dealer and racer, Don Yenke. Don was fiercely competitive, and a person who could understand what his cars were doing mechanically. Later he would become best known for his Yenke Camaros.

Dick Thompson, aka the “Flying Dentist” was on the team as well. Together Dick and Don began driving Corvettes for Gulf Oil Racing in 1961 and won the National Championship that year.

On February 11, 1962, Davis, Yenke and Thompson brought their Corvettes to the opening race in the World Sports Car Championship series at Daytona International Speedway. The two Gulf Oil Corvettes came in 1st and 2nd, with another Corvette privateer taking 3rd for a Corvette podium sweep. The team would go on to take the B Production class championship in 1962 and 1963 with Gulf Oil Corvettes.

This Croton watch was given to Don Yenke by Grady Davis after the 1963 racing season. The watch is engraved “To Don from Grady ‘63” on the back.

### Dyno Graph Shows Crazy Differences Between LT2 and C8 Corvette Z06's LT6

*How and where the LT2 and LT6 make their power is a truly fascinating lesson in powerplants.*

The crowning jewel of the C8 Corvette Z06 is and always has been its amazing powerplant, the brand-new, flat-plane crank LT6 V8. Producing an incredible 670 peak horsepower, the LT6 instantly became the world's most powerful naturally-aspirated production V8, despite the fact that it displaces just 5.5 liters or 336 cubic inches. It's truly a technical marvel of a powerplant, but Corvette Forum member imxz28 recently posted a dyno graph in this thread that sheds even more light on how different this engine is from the Stingray's LT2 in terms of its power curve.

It doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure out that the flat-plane crank engine makes the bulk of its power high in the rev range, because, well, it has a redline that's considerably higher than the traditional LT2 – 8,600 rpm versus 6,500 rpm. As we can see from the chart, the LT2's torque hits at a much lower rpm, however, which was expected but still nice to see in graphical form. That torque curve remains relatively flat throughout the rev range but does begin to drop off after 5,000 rpm or so.

Meanwhile, the LT2's horse-

power comes on strong at a little under 3,000 rpm and climbs dramatically until it surpasses 5,000 rpm and then levels off completely. The LT6, on the other hand, is a different animal altogether. Both horsepower and torque start to come on just before 2,000 rpm, but neither really climb dramatically until the engine passes 3,000 rpm, as is the case with the LT2. From there, horsepower doesn't catch up with torque until 5,000 rpm, and then things get really interesting as torque levels off and horsepower just keeps on going, all the way to that lofty aforementioned redline.

Amazingly, the flat-plane crank engine is still making 400 +pound-feet of torque at and beyond 5,000 rpm, which is not typical of high-revving, small-displacement engines of any kind. Of course, this engine makes far less peak torque than horsepower, but those limits will only be reached by those that rev it out accordingly. Either way, this chart proves that the LT6 is a technological and engineering powerhouse, and it's one that we can't wait to experience for ourselves.
