





Governor's Report—Clyde Mooney



The East Region held its first Governor's Meeting for 2022 on Saturday, March 19, 2022 at the Holiday Inn, Grantville, PA.

Prior to the Governor's Meeting John Cantelmo and David Walter, con-

vention chairs, held a meeting to review the status of planning for the 2022 NCCC National Convention being held in Atlantic City, NJ June 12th through June 17th and hosted by the East Region. Kurt Steidle and I attended the meeting on behalf of LCCC to provide an update on our planning to run the low-speed auto-cross. Kurt advised that we have secured all new timing equipment, provided a list of our volunteers along with contact information, plus a diagram of the planned course layout. We are in good shape but could still use a few more volunteers to help.

Due to time constraints not all convention activities were covered but some of the key items were:

300 registrations have been received.

38 members (21 cars) have signed up for the concours show.

65 have registered for the low-speed auto cross.

14 have registered for the adult valve cover races.

The only real concern voiced, was the lack of registration from members of the East Region, which the convention had counted on attending. From the beginning, it was anticipated that due to the location on the east coast, there could be a limiting effect due to travel distance as compared to a more central location. There is a real need for our regions membership to step up and register.

I picked up convention apparel, three of our club members had ordered, and will deliver at the next meeting. If anyone else would like to place an order (the form is in the newsletter) just note on the form to give to me at the May 14th Governor's Meeting and East Region Show. Or better yet attend the show and pick up yourself.

As soon as the convention meeting concluded, Andy

Alleshouse, Regional Executive, called the Governor's Meeting to order. Being a glutton for punishment Kurt, decided to also sit through this meeting. The first order of business was the reciting the Pledge of Allegiance followed by participant introductions. Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were presented and with no corrections or changes, they were approved.

Regional Membership Director as well as National VP of Membership were in attendance and gave status reports. Nationally NCCC has over 17,000 members while the East Region currently has 1830 members with Cumberland Valley Corvette Club being the largest with 189 members. LCCC with 127 members ranks seventh.

From the competition report it was confirmed that there will be no regional sanctions, therefore, we will be limited to 10 national sanctions. The result is that a proposal was made to revise the East Region Standing Rules to bring them in line with the national standing rules as follows:

8.1.2 Sanctioned Events

- i Each club is allocated sanctions up to the maximum number allowed by NCCC rules (10).
- ii Each club may use sanction numbers to reach their total allocated sanctions for the year providing they follow the subsequent criteria; 1) all sanctions are in accordance with NCCC rules, 2) all sanctions are approved by RCD, 3) no sanctioned events shall be held on the day of an ER Governor's Meeting unless sponsored by the ER at the location of the Governor's Meeting.
- iii Sanctions must follow the same criteria in the NCCC rulebook regarding maximum of sanctions held per day, mileage between events, sanction request, flyer, and results submission.
- iv All sanction request, flyer, and results submission must be scheduled and reported using the NCCC national competition database (NCD).

The proposal will be voted on at the next governor's meeting.



1956 Daytona Trophy Presented To Betty Skelton

As we celebrate Women in History Month, there are those in the Corvette world who immediately come to mind, such as Dollie Cole, Elfi Arkus-Duntov, Donna Mae Mims, and most recently, Racing Program Manager, Laura Klauser. In going through our collection of artifacts though, Betty Skelton's trophy stood out as a great object for this Artifact of the Month installment.

First Lady of Firsts



1956 Daytona Trophy Presented to Betty Skelton

Known as "The First Lady of Firsts" and "The Fastest Woman on Earth" Betty Skelton was born in Pensacola, Florida in 1926. She took an interest in airplanes very early in her childhood. By the age of eight, after years of watching aircraft from the Pensacola Naval Air Station from her backyard, Betty told her parents that she wanted to be a pilot. Her parents began taking her to the local municipal airport where Betty would hop a ride with any pilot that would take her.

During these flights she met Navy Ensign Kenneth Wright who would teach her to fly. Ensign Wright let Betty take the controls of his plane when she was only 12 years old! On her 16th birthday, Betty would make her first legal solo flight, which would lead her to become one of the most successful female pilots in both aerobatic flight and in setting speed records.

After an amazing career in aviation, Betty moved to North Carolina and would meet Bill France, the legendary founder of NASCAR. Bill would convince Betty to drive at the Daytona Speed Weeks where, from 1954 to 1955, she would set numerous records. In 1956, Betty would find herself working at the Campbell-Ewald advertising firm for General Motors' Chevrolet Division. She was GM's first female technical narrator at auto shows and appeared in television and print ads. She continued driving and returned to Daytona in a 1956 Corvette specially prepared by Zora Arkus-Duntov and Smokey Yunick, and ran the flying mile at 137 mph. This trophy was presented to Betty for this record setting run.

Although Betty Skelton was never an astronaut, she was given the respect of an astronaut by most, including the Mercury Seven. The Mercury Seven were the seven men who would become America's first astronauts that flew in all Mercury missions. Betty had met Wally Schirra, one of the Mercury Seven, in 1948 at a hangar in Pensacola. Wally was impressed by Betty and her capabilities as a pilot, which he never forgot about. When LOOK magazine wanted to write an article on women being in space, they worked with NASA to put Betty Skelton through the same tests as the Mercury Seven. Betty had already accomplished numerous firsts in her career, but as the first woman to pass through astronaut training, Betty proved that women were just as capable as men, in a rocket or in a Corvette.

CORVETTE RACING AT SEBRING: What a Win!

*Garcia, Taylor, Catsburg, No. 3 Corvette C8.R
take 12th victory in 12 Hours.*

SEBRING, Fla. (March 19, 2022) – Corvette Racing made it a dozen victories in the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring on Saturday, the first victory in America's oldest sports car race for the mid-engine Chevrolet Corvette C8.R.

Antonio Garcia, Jordan Taylor and Nicky Catsburg teamed for the landmark win with the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Corvette in the second round of the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. The trio combined to lead 247 laps or 913.9 miles for Corvette Racing's first Sebring 12 Hours win since 2017 and 12th since 2002.

It also marks the first win for the GTD PRO-spec Corvette C8.R in its second race as part of the new class. The result goes along with a runner-up GTE Pro finish for Tommy Milner and Nick Tandy in Friday's 1,000 Miles of Sebring for the FIA World Endurance Championship.

"Congratulations to Antonio Garcia, Jordan Taylor, Nicky Catsburg and everyone on the No. 3 Corvette C8.R team," said Jim Campbell, Chevrolet U.S. vice president, Performance and Motorsports. "Winning in class for the 12th time at the 12 Hours of Sebring is the result of great driving, race strategy and execution of pit stops. The Corvette C8.R's 5.5-liter, flat-plane V-8 engine delivered the right combination of performance, reliability and efficiency throughout the race.

"This win is even more special thanks to the support of so many Corvette owners and fans at the track and around the world," Campbell added. "This has been a great weekend with a runner-up class finish in the World Endurance Championship on Friday and now this win in IMSA. I'm proud of everyone at Corvette Racing and our

technical partners at Mobil 1 and Michelin."

The No. 3 Corvette also won the Sebring round of the Michelin Endurance Cup – a championship

consisting of Sebring, the Rolex 24 At Daytona, Sahlen's Six Hours of The Glen and Petit Le Mans. Points were awarded at the four-, eight- and 12-hour marks.

Corvette Racing wasted little time going to the front in the race. Garcia set the table from the beginning as he advanced from his third-place starting position to the head of GTD PRO. He passed six cars in his opening two hours before handing off to Taylor for an impressive three-hour run.

Catsburg drove an equally stirring three hours, 18 minutes in the middle of the race. He soldiered through four full-course caution periods and enjoyed a highlight-reel battle with Pfaff Motorsports' Matt Campbell for the GTD PRO lead at the seven-and-a-half-hour mark. The two raced side-by-side for three corners before Catsburg pulled ahead.

That left Taylor to drive one stint before Garcia closed with a triple-stint to score the victory.

Corvette Racing engineers dedicated significant time at a February test to gain a better understanding of the performance and degradation levels of the GTD Michelin tires, which are different than what the team has used in past seasons. That combined with more than 51,000 racing miles across the familiar bumps around the 3.7-mile, 17-turn Sebring circuit was the right combination.

Corvette Racing's next event in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship is April 8-9 at the Long Beach (Calif.) street circuit.
