# **Brad Paisley's 1961 Corvette**

In 2002, country music star Brad Paisley bought his first Corvette, a used 1999 C5. Paisley, whose grandfather was a Pontiac salesman, came from a family of car enthusiasts. Once he had the means to buy a performance car, an automobile he could drive for fun, Paisley chose the Corvette, kickstarting his love for America's Sports Car.



Paisley has a much larger automobile collection now, including a 1961 Roman Red Corvette currently on display at the National Corvette Museum. Corvettes from 1961 featured a restyled boattail rear fascia and, for the first time, four taillights. Paisley's Corvette also includes white coves on both sides. The red with white coves color combination is a personal favorite of Paisley's, who owns a Corvette-inspired tour bus decorated with the iconic red and white coves livery.

Along with the 1961 Corvette, the Museum's display includes several other artifacts on loan from Paisley, honoring his music career and love of Corvettes. One is a Corvette-themed carbon fiber guitar, created by custom guitar designer Bill Crook in 2012. Featuring the Corvette crossed flags and a Z06 emblem, the guitar reflects the innovative use of carbon fiber in modern Corvettes. Next to the guitar is a vinyl record of Fifth Gear, Paisley's 2007 studio album, which has five number one songs and was certified platinum in 2008. A third artifact is a poster celebrating Paisley's 20 million worldwide sales, including gold records and images of his studio albums through 2017.

Several of Paisley's biggest hits reference cars, driving, and the freedom of the open road. In a 2015 interview with Car and Driver, Paisley reflected on the influence of automobiles in American culture, comparing cars to clothing. In that regard, Paisley has "worn" several Corvettes. A collection that started with his 1999 C5 also includes a 2020 Long Beach Red Stingray, which he received through the R8C delivery program at the National Corvette Museum. Yet the 1961 Corvette, with its classic red paint and white coves, is the one that inspired, in Paisley's opinion, possibly the most attractive and iconic design for any automobile.



# **The Holy Grail**

Well, it has finally happened, I am officially an old guy. Social Security begins this month and semiretirement next year. Seven decades have passed. There is no getting around it, the years ahead are less than the ones behind. My wife, Diane and I, have been working on a bucket list and it was time to check one off. We were going to visit the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green Kentucky, the Holy Grail of all things Corvette! I had been talking about visiting the museum for years, and now was the time.

We began our journey by accompanying our daughter and her family to Dinosaur-land in White Post, Virgina. The grandchildren enjoyed seeing over 50 life sized dinosaurs. It was then lunchtime, and we went to a local park for food and fun. For my birthday we bought four radio-controlled stunt cars. The grands had great fun chasing around the park the cars that they were controlling. We then went to Skyline Caverns and went underground to see God's handiwork in the caverns and rock formations. At the end of the tour, we parted company with our family and



headed to Kentucky. From our home in Lititz the distance

to Bowling Green is about 715 miles, taking over 11 hours to complete the trip, without stopping. This was going to be a two-day journey.

When we arrived at the Museum, I was expecting to see a parking lot full of Corvettes, but I only saw about five.

As fun as it is to drive my Vette, two days in the car is a



bit much. Since it was lunch time, we headed to the Stingray Grill and enjoyed a Velocity burger and fries.

As members of the museum, we did not have to pay an admission fee, however there was a small fee for the tour, which took about an hour. We learned some amazing things about the cars that we love so much.

As you may know, the Corvette, began production in 1953 as America's answer to the British sports cars that the GIs from World War 2 loved and often had shipped back to America. It had humble beginnings and was a far cry from the cars that we have today, but it was the beginning of a love affair that has lasted over seventy years.





When the Corvette project began, it was under the name, Opel. It is not clear why this name was used (perhaps they were trying to keep quiet what they were working on). Opel was the name of a German car company that GM acquired in 1929. After the Opel name was dropped the name Cougar was used but this was short lived. On December 10, 1952, the car's name was officially changed to Corvette. Many naval veterans, no doubt some of the ones buying British sports cars and

shipping them home, would have been familiar with the name Corvette as it was a lightweight, agile warship. The name would have evoked an image of something small, fast, powerful and something to own.

The early Corvettes were not great cars. In 1953 the only engine offered was a straight 6-cylinder

with a two-speed automatic transmission. It didn't even have roll up windows or door handles! In 1955 an 8-cylinder engine was offered, and Corvette was developing into a "real car". Competition from the Ford Thunderbird nearly ended the Corvette,



before it even got started.



There were some amazing cars on display along with some even more amazing stories about these cars. One such story is about a man named Richard Sampson of Brunswick, Maine. He bought a brand new 1954 Corvette and loved the car. His wife, not so much. After five years he did something rather unusual. You see, he was the owner of a chain of grocery stores. He decided to entomb the Corvette in his newest store. He had a small window in the tomb so that he could look at it when so moved. The car remained entombed until 1982 (13 years after

his death). The new owners of the store wanted it removed so they contacted Richard's daughter who had the car shipped to Daytona Beach, Florida, where she had it on display in her living room for the next 10 years.

Most Corvette fans are familiar with the name, Zora Arkus-Duntov, who is considered the Godfather of the Corvette. There is a plaque in the Museum that briefly tells his story and influence on Corvette. He was a contemporary



of, and friends with, Bugatti, Porsche, Allard and Shelby. He also raced at Le Mans, winning twice in his class. He married Elfi Wolff and together they were ambassadors for Corvette well into their 80s. Their ashes are entombed and on



exhibit at the Museum. He retired from Chevrolet in 1975 but purchased a 1974 Covette as it was (then) the last year of the big block. His partially restored car is on display, the only Corvette that he ever bought. There are other amazing cars on display including the one and only 1983 Corvette.

During the space race, GM would lease a new Chevrolet to our astronauts for \$1 per year. Most chose Corvettes! Jim Lovell's 1968 Silverstone Silver Corvette is on display.



In an exhibit titled, "Pop Culture and Corvette: An American love affair", about 12 Corvettes are on display from various movies, including Elvis Presley's 1959


Stingray racer from Clambake, the 1965 Stingray, driven by a young James Kirk in the rebooted Star Trek movie and the green C6 in Transformers.

On February 12, 2014, the world awoke to news of a 40'x 30' sink hole that had opened up under the

Museum swallowing eight one-of-a-kind Corvettes, including the 2009 ZRI Blue Devil, a 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary 1993 car, and the 1992, 1 millionth produced car. Seven of the cars have been restored. To my surprise the museum did





lifted out of the sink hole it was driven out of the Museum! If you have not seen it, there is a video on YouTube of the sink hole opening up and one of a race between the Blue Devil and a U.S. Navy Blue Angel. Check them out!

In another part of the museum, you will see various prototypes and clay models of cars in development. There is also a section where cars are being restored.

There were about 6 Corvettes on display waiting for their new owners to take them home. It's called Museum Delivery. Anyone purchasing a new Corvette can take delivery of their car at the museum (for an extra fee) instead of their local dealer. If you are planning on visiting the Museum, you can arrange museum delivery of your current car. Wouldn't that be fun!

The Museum raffles off about 12 new Corvettes per year. If you didn't win the club's raffle car, you can have another opportunity to win a new Corvette through the Museum. New this year, if you prefer something older, is a sweepstakes to win a fully restored 1967 Stingray convertible.

The final stop on the tour is the gift shop where you can purchase souvenirs from your visit.

For those of us old enough to remember film cameras, there is a place outside the Museum for your Kodak moment where you can have you and your beloved car photographed in front of the Museum. A "must" for anyone who visits with their Corvette.

Exhibits change periodically, and I did not have time to visit the track, and the factory tours were full, so another visit is order. Care to join me?

Trailer & Porta potty left overnight Closed course; no pedestrian or other unwanted traffic


