### **General Meeting and Executive Board Summary**

### General Meeting–December 11, 2023

The December general meeting of the Lancaster County Corvette Club was held on Wednesday, December 11, 2023 at the Timbers in Mount Gretna as part of the Annual Christmas Dinner. The meeting was called to order by President Kurt Steidle at 6:30PM with the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Our guests for the evening were from the Clare House – Amanda Richardson, Director and Sarah Popovich, Board President. There were no mentioned concerns for members.

#### Governor's Report-Clyde Mooney

Scott Breneman, Mary Anne Lewandowski, and I attended the last 2023 Governor's Meeting (my final one) on Saturday, December 2, 2023, at the Holiday Inn, Grantville, PA. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM followed with the Pledge of Allegiance, attendee introductions and a role call of those participating via ZOOM.

Secretary's and Treasurer's report was presented by Michele Cantelmo and Rocky Alleshouse on behalf of Valerie Cifuni respectively. With no comments or corrections motions were made and seconded to approve both reports which passed.

John Cantelmo – Regional Competition Director: Discussion of electric vehicles being allowed to participate in NCCC events continued at the National Governor's Meeting with Allen Morris -NCCC Business Manager, stating that there is no exclusion of EV's in our insurance. The end result – it is up to each region to vote if they want to allow EV's at their events. The East Region Governors voted to allow EV's at all events and a revision to the region's Standing Rules is in process.

The proposed event dates for East Region clubs were reviewed with the only issue being our request of an autocross on April 28th which conflicts with the Cumberland Valley Corvette Clubs – Pocono Driving School. We have requested changing that event to April 14th, which we expect will be allowed. Dates that are approved are: June 9th Double Autocross, June 16th Stauffer's Show, September 22nd Double Autocross, September 29th American Legends Show, and October 6th Double Autocross.

The East Region is planning on having the second 2024 Governor's Meeting June 1 &2 at the Classic Auto Mall and Holiday Inn, Morgantown, PA. Tenta-

tive schedule is: Morning of Saturday, June 1 tour the auto mall. Afternoon car show while governor's meeting takes place followed by a Funkhana and awards dinner. Then Sunday, June 2 Rallye. This is our regions only fund raiser and your participation is needed.

Scott Fredericks – Regional Membership Director: As of November 11th, NCCC had a total of 18,839 members and 242 clubs. As always, he stressed the need for complete and accurate information (no abbreviations) when entering information into the database.

It was reported that NCCC is considering an increase in dues for 2025. Primary member would be \$35.00 (up from \$25.00) and Spouse/Companion would be \$15.00 (up from \$10.00). New members would be \$45.00. Hard to believe that the last increase was in 1986.

#### Miscellaneous stuff:

The NCCC Scholarship Application opened on November 11th and will close on April 10, 2024. The value is \$1,500.00. Information on applying is on the NCCC website.

Four LCCC members earned awards in 2023: Joe and Bard Schulter and Sharon Roberts as workers and myself as competitor.

2024 budget was presented again and after too much discussion was approved without change.

All proposed changes to the Competition Rule Book were approved and the new 2024/2025 Rule Book will be available soon.

2024 Membership Cards will be sent January/ February.

That's all folks. The next report will be from Scott. Hope everyone has a great holiday season, a happy, healthy, and a great 2024 filled with Corvette fun.

The festivities of the night would continue – dinner, singing, gift exchange - but the official meeting would come to an end. Jan Gerhart motioned to adjourn and Clyde Mooney seconded. All were in favor and the last general meeting of the 2023 year ended at 6:41PM.

#### Executive Board Meeting–December 27, 2023

The last of 2023 Executive Board Meeting of the Lancaster County Corvette Club was held on Wed., December 27, 2023 at the Roberts home beginning at 6:00 PM. Present were Kurt & Joan Steidle, Clyde & Sue Mooney, Rick and Angie Evans, Carl and Valerie Lally, Scott Breneman, Jim and Sharon Roberts, Mike and Sue Baker and Cody Howry.

Rick reported that the Christmas Dinner went well – and actually came in under budget. He will have a budget for the Annual Awards Banquet next month.

Kurt has selected a committee to oversee the Awards selection which is now open for nominations on "Survey Monkey".

The Secretary's report for the December General meeting minutes was approved after a motion made by Clyde, seconded by Carl and passed by all.

The Treasurer's report was discussed and accepted after a motion made by Clyde, seconded by Kurt.

Kurt has been hard at work updating the Website – expect to see some changes for the future. There will be a password change in mid-January, it was printed on the back of the 2024 LCCC membership cards. Kurt also announced that this is his last year as President. He has started an outline of duties and responsibilities of his office to help a successor fulfill the post. He suggested that the other officers consider making a sheet for their office, also.

Clyde said that he and Scott have worked together on the computer reports, filing of memberships and attended meetings – Scott is ready to take over the position of Governor. The new 24-25 rule book for NCCC is coming out. There is a chance that there will be a push for raising the NCCC dues in '25.

Mike reported the 2024 membership now stands at 115; 75 primary and 40 other.

The previously discussed auction for cones did not work out. Therefore, after Scott's research into current costs, a motion was made by Clyde and seconded by Kurt to purchase 36 cones for the '24 year not to exceed \$300 - motion passed.

Carl had a discussion with the Veterans Court office on having their participation with the LCCC events. The possibility of donating gift certificates to the Vet's program for good volunteers was discussed. We will wait and see how it develops.

### **General Meeting and Executive Board Summary**

As far as we know – a new Corvette has not been ordered yet for our '24 raffle. Kurt will check further with Whitmoyer's – to see if Lance Miller has spoken with them.

New officer shirts will be ordered by Clyde for Sue Baker, Mike Baker, Cody Howry and Scott Breneman.

Scott brought up the club trailer – the roof and awning need attention – and the inspection is due in the spring. Rick will look into pricing for repairs and we will contact Joe Schulter on the inspection.

Clyde motioned that the meeting be adjourned – seconded by all – ending the '23 business at 6:41PM so we could eat dinner.

### Five Awards to Be Presented at The Annual Awards Banquet and Dinner Dance in March.

The following are the award categories with a description of each:

**LCCC Lifetime Achievement Award**—One person, recognized annually, for the consistently outstanding participation, involvement and contributions to the club throughout their membership tenure. Recognition should be limited to those individuals who have been members for 15 years or more.

**LCCC Outstanding Worker(s)**—Recognition of an individual or couple that consistently 'steps-up' to help in club activities throughout the year. Often, they go above and beyond in their efforts.

**LCCC Unsung Hero**–Recognition of an individual member that typically 'flies below the radar', but consistently shows up, [participates and gets involved in a variety of club activities.

**Outstanding Leader(s)**—Recognition for an individual or couple who both actively participate in the club's various activities and events, including taking leadership/organizing roles in a variety of activities or events.

**Outstanding New Member**—Rookie recognition of an individual member who has recently joined the club (since July of the previous year). These new members have jumped in 'headfirst' to participate in activities or events and actively support the club.
