## Hard Topics Needing Discussion

Over the years, the club's leadership has made every effort to control costs to the membership. This has been done by carefully managing club expenses while avoiding increasing the prices for our membership and events.

Our show prices have remained stable and low. Since 2010, the world around us has changed. When the dues were raised in the middle of the last decade, a \$20 voucher was offered to provide some relief and to encourage participation.

We did raise our prices

for autocrosses to address the replacement of aged and worn-out equipment. Along the way, we have also replaced pop-up canopies, radios, cones and a public address system. These are used at shows as well as at autocrosses.

Our annual events such as the Christmas Party and Awards Banquet are subsidized by the club and these are costing more each year.

Recently, some club costs were compared to 2010. The costs from that year were also plugged into the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statis-

tics website where they have tool to calculate the consumer price index (CPI) from one time period to another. You can look for yourself at: [CPI Inflation Calculator \(bls.gov\)](https://www.bls.gov/inflation-calculator)

The values were compared from January 2010 to January 2022. What is obvious is that what the club charges for much of our activities and events is not in line with reality. Refer to the table on page 14 to see what the member costs were in 2010 compared to 2022 for dues, the Christmas Party and the Annual Awards Banquet.

## Achieving Our Goal

Our goal is to provide the charities with the best possible outcome from this raffle. Your board has high confidence that this raffle will be successful. The reasons include:

- The C8 Corvettes remain highly desired and difficult to obtain.
- People continue to spend despite the lingering effects of the pandemic and the resulting economic fallout.
- We are not offering a base equipped car, the 2LT package brings a lot of 'goodies' to the table.
- We have re-established the club's Raffle Car over the past six years. This means people seek us out. They like the charities, they like the way the raffle is run, and they like that it is simple.
- They also like CORVETTES!

Last year, we increased the price to offset the extra cost of the 2LT trim level and we set another record with another early sellout. There were discussions regarding the risk/reward aspect of increasing the price yet again. A compromise was made to raise the price to \$150 per

ticket. While this may seem aggressive, it really is not. It is good business that reflects the market conditions as they are. The Executive Board decided to take this opportunity to make the most of the current situation.

When you read the flyer, you will notice that payment is accepted via cash, check or money order—no credit cards. This is the same as last

year when we learned that there is a section within the Pennsylvania law on Small Games of Chance (Title 61, Chapter 901, Section 901.506) that prohibits the use of credit cards (including debit cards).

Aside from everyone's regular contact with friends, family, colleagues, neighbors, we have three great selling opportunities in the coming months:

The GM Nationals at Carlisle are Friday, June 24th and Saturday, June 25th.

The Z06 Dealer Tour at Whitmoyer Chevrolet is Thursday, July 28th.

Corvettes at Carlisle is Thursday, August 25th through Saturday, August 27th.

All three events will be prime selling opportunities for us. Like last year, the GM nationals will have more of a Corvette-flavor due to the change in schedule for York County Corvette Club's Corvettes for Chip Show. This will now operate like a show within a show.

## Doing Your Part

I encourage all members to get involved. Reach out to people who have bought from you in the past, ask at work or church or your neighbors and please buy one (or more) yourself! Send out e-mails or letters to your contacts.

Volunteer to help at the major selling events. It can actually be a lot of fun.

You get to meet people who like to talk about...what else, Corvettes!

Finally, here are three simple guidelines to follow:

One—Tickets are \$150 per ticket.

Two—When you take tickets, you are responsible for them. When we get closer to the Corvettes at Carlisle week, you are expected to return any unsold tickets, unopened. Opened envelopes should be accompanied by money. "I lost them" is not acceptable.

Three—Do not open any tickets until you have their money in your hand. You are not being rude to ask for money upfront before handing over or opening an envelope. In past years, we have had at least one or more people change their mind once an envelope is opened. Don't let that happen!

## Governor's Report—Clyde Mooney



The East Region's second Governor's Meeting for 2022 was held on Saturday,

May 14<sup>th</sup> at the Holiday Inn, Grantville, PA. In conjunction with the Governor's meeting, a review meeting of the preparation for the NCCC National Convention which our region is hosting in June took place. Additionally, the region was conducting a seven-sanction people's choice fun show while the meetings were taking place to be followed by an awards luncheon.

It was great to be joined by Valerie and Henry Cifuni, Mary Anne and Scott Lewandowski, Kurt Steidle, along with my wife Sue at the events.

John Cantelmo, convention chairman, lead a review of where we are in preparation for the convention. After a year and a half of effort, things are coming together and all indications are that it will be a great affair. If there is any

negative it is the number of reservations that have been received, especially from the East Region. As I write this a total of 335 have registered for the convention, 25 for the judged concours, 24 for high speed and 66 for low speed autocross (which is the event LCCC is running), and 33 for the rallye. However, the demand for trips has been so high that it was necessary to increase the number of buses.

When the convention review was completed, the Governor's Meeting was immediately called to order and attendee introductions were made. Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were presented, and with no corrections or changes being required, they were approved.

Membership was reported as 17,783 with 234 clubs in total with the East Region having 1,868 members and 24 clubs.

Competition reviewed several proposed changes to either the By-Laws or the Standing Rules, most of which are simply to clear

up verbiage and will have no impact on our club. They will be brought up to vote in October. The other area of discussion was on the signing of waivers, they must be completed correctly with out exception, and the issue of safety at all events. There have been several cases of serious injury within the Western States Corvette Council and in fact they have lost their insurance coverage. Needless to say, NCCC is aware of this and very concerned that we take care to prevent incidents at all of our events, be it a car show, autocross, parade, cruise, etc.

The East Region Standing Rule that was proposed at the last Governor's Meeting to limit the number of sanctioned events to 10 was tabled since the ability to hold 4 regional sanctioned events has been reinstated.

With the show in process, a motion was made to conclude the meeting was made and passed. The meeting for once was adjourned early. Yes!



We should be charging \$81.09 for dues when comparing to the 2010 figure. The Christmas Party should be \$12.97 and the Awards Banquet should be \$32.44 when compared to the \$25.00 we currently charge. If compared to the 2010 price where a gift was included for all participants, it should be \$48.66!

In 2010, cost included a gift. The gift was eliminated to reduce cost to the member.

As previously stated, the club subsidizes the Christmas Party and Awards Banquet. The 2021 Awards Banquet held this past March cost the club \$3,150.95 (\$4,285.95 expense less \$1,135.00 income). This was after considerable effort to reign in

the expense of the event. It was a great evening and those who worked so hard on the banquet deserve your thanks.

The fact is, \$25 doesn't come close to offsetting what members enjoyed that night. The same analysis can be made for our other events and activities. This statement should not be misunderstood as a plea to do away with the subsidies and dramatically increase the cost to the members. It is an effort to bring awareness to the membership that some action is needed. The actions needed are not limited to member costs but we need to review everything we are charging from entry fees for our shows to what we charge for the use of our Corvettes in community parades.

I believe this is a better time to have an open discussion rather than wait to just before we post renewal forms or flyers for next years events.

I invite all comments to be forwarded to the Executive Board. An open discussion will be included in the agenda at upcoming meetings. Please be respectful, constructive and concise in your feedback.





### Corvette Pace Car Collection Sells For \$1.375 Million At Mecum Indy

Last week's Mecum Auctions 35th Annual Indy Spring Classic saw 2,504 vehicles cross the block, with total revenue for the event topping \$126 million. The third most expensive lot sold was \$159, the Dr. Richard Foster Chevy Corvette Pace Car Collection that changed hands for \$1,375,000.

years bringing together an exhaustive Pace Car collection which includes six Corvette Pace Car Editions, eight Indy Motor Speedway authorized replicas, and two Official Pace Cars. Four of the six Corvette Pace Car Editions have received honors from Bloomington Gold or the National Corvette Restorers Society. Many of the Corvettes are exceedingly low-mileage examples, with several showing fewer than one hundred miles driven. The entire collection was sold as a single lot.



As we reported in late April, the collection was comprised of nineteen Corvette Pace Cars. No other car has been honored to be an Indianapolis 500 pace car as many times as the Chevy Corvette. Several of these pace cars have been reproduced as replicas and sold to the public, whereas others were built specifically for the event.

Dr. Foster has long been a dedicated fan of the Corvette Pace Cars, and has spent a number of
