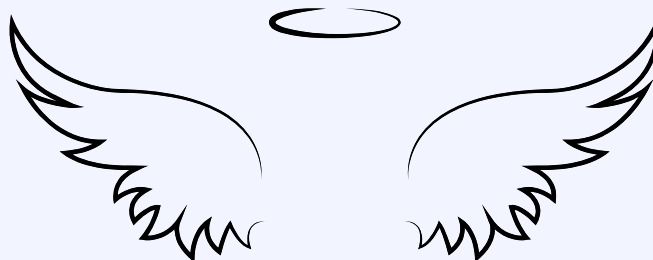

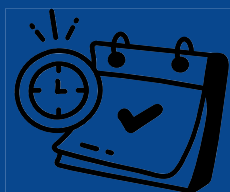

Captain America's 1970 Star Spangled Corvette



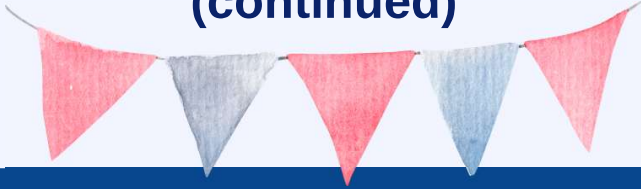
A one-of-a-kind piece of Corvette history is now on display at the National Corvette Museum. The 1970 Star Spangled Corvette Stingray combines the unmistakable shape of a third-generation Corvette with a hand-painted tribute to the American flag. The patriotic red, white, and blue design features 50 individually painted stars. Its original owner, David "Captain America" Dugan, created the livery and spent the 1970s driving the Corvette to baseball games, parades, and community events throughout California.

A Rolling Tribute to American Service Members

Dugan used the Star Spangled Corvette to show his support for U.S. troops serving overseas and for service members returning home from the Vietnam War. With its bold design and meaningful purpose, the Corvette quickly became a familiar sight at public gatherings across the state. Its popularity extended beyond those appearances. The Star Spangled Corvette was featured in magazines, displayed on posters, and photographed at events, helping establish it as one of the era's most recognizable custom Corvettes.

More than five decades later, the Star-Spangled Corvette continues to appear at car shows and automotive events. Its preservation keeps alive the story of one Corvette enthusiast's distinctive tribute to American service members and the communities that welcomed them home. The car also reflects the long history of Corvette owners using America's Sports Car as a form of personal expression. From its individually painted stars to its decades of public appearances, every detail contributes to a story that extends far beyond the vehicle itself.
