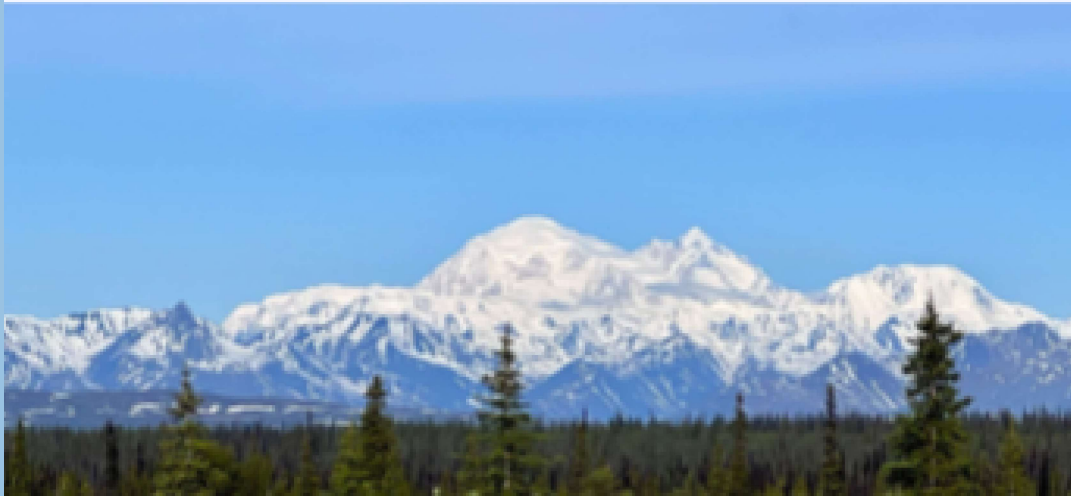

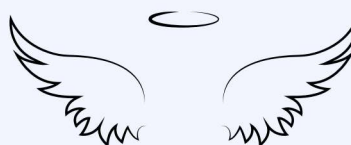

The 2026 Raffle Car has been acquired from Ciocca Corvette by Lance Miller. This year the car is well appointed with some notable options including the Front Lift Adjustable Height, GT2 Bucket Seats, 20-Spoke Forged Aluminum Gloss Black Wheels, Sueded Microfiber-Wrapped Steering Wheel, and Low Rear Spoiler and Front Splitter. It is again a 2LT Coupe and it has a jet black interior. You can start talking it up and getting ready to sell all 1000 tickets again this year.

For those who are new to the club, we have the good fortune to run the operations of this annual raffle on behalf of the Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation. All the proceeds go directly to our two charities, the Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation and The Clare House. Remember, this is not our raffle, we just run it for the Miller organization with the help of The Clare House staff. For that work, they are gracious enough to give half the proceeds to our charity, The Clare House. Our club does not keep any of the funds. This event raises the most money by far for our charities and it takes a lot of help to make it successful each year.

We sell in three main ways, 1) Individual sales, 2) through the mail, 3) at shows—the biggest being the Corvettes at Carlisle Show. We ask each member of the club to sell or buy tickets. If each member buys 1 and sells 1, we would reach 20% of our goal. Because we are well known for this raffle, customers seek us out to get their tickets. However, since we are not sure what the weather will be like at our last and biggest event, we need to sell as many as we can before that Corvettes at Carlisle weekend. Lisa and I will have a lot more information as things progress. For now, here are things to remember:

- Tickets are \$150 each
 - The drawing to determine the winner is the 7PM drawing of the PA Pick 3 on Saturday August 29, 2026.
 - We need EVERYONE to help buy or sell tickets.
 - Sign-up sheets are going around at our General Meeting for the 3 events where we need help: the envelope stuffing, the GM Nationals selling, and the Corvettes at Carlisle selling.
- There are multiple opportunities to help, just let Lisa and I know how you want to be involved.

LCCC JULY E-Board Meeting Minutes

The Executive Board Meeting of the Lancaster County Corvette Club was held on Wednesday, July 22, 2026, at the Roberts' home beginning at 7:00 PM. Present were Lisa and Tony DeFelice, Mike and Sue Baker, Jim and Sharon Roberts, Bart and Terri Hollis, Scott Breneman and Mary Anne Lewandowski.

Concerns for members: Craig Foreman's mom passed away on 7/8/2026. Her memorial service is scheduled for 8/3/2026.

Old Business:

Raffle Car Update – Tony and Lisa DeFelice reported 341 tickets sold as of tonight. 20-30 expected to come in yet. We usually go to Carlisle with about 400 tickets left, but we may have about 600 left when we get to Carlisle. There are 200 outstanding tickets which we do not know if these are sold yet. The Board asked about what happens if not all tickets are sold- we pay for the car first and once this is paid, divide the rest of the money between the charities. Lisa reported that she did receive another email request for a ticket yesterday. Clyde and Scott are regularly checking the mailbox and taking care of any requests that are received.

Trailer Maintenance – Scott Breneman reported that the trailer is still at the garage for inspection. All work to get it ready for inspection was completed by Scott and Mike. National Corvette Museum Earns American Alliance of Museums Core Documents Verification



The National Corvette Museum has earned Core Documents Verification from the American Alliance of Museums, a milestone that recognizes the Museum's commitment to professional standards, responsible stewardship, and long-term planning. The verification followed an expert review of the Museum's educational mission and its policies for ethics, institutional planning, emergency preparedness, and collections stewardship. These documents are considered essential for museums operating in accordance with accepted professional practices.

Core Documents Verification confirms that the policies guiding the Museum's work are current, well-defined, and aligned with professional museum standards. Those policies support decisions across the organization, from caring for the collection and serving the public to planning for the Museum's future. The National Corvette Museum pursued the review as part of its ongoing work to strengthen operations, support accountability, and protect the story of Corvette, America's Sports Car. The designation also reinforces the Museum's responsibility to preserve historically significant Corvettes and more than 50,000 Corvette-related artifacts for future generations. Core Documents Verification is part of the American Alliance of Museums' Continuum of Excellence, which helps museums evaluate their practices and build a strong foundation for continued growth.
