

Preserving a Rare Chapter of Corvette History: The 1993 Black Rose ZR-1



Preservation work at the National Corvette Museum is about more than restoring a vehicle's appearance. It is about honoring engineering, safeguarding authenticity, and ensuring that rare Corvettes continue to tell their stories for generations to come. One of the Museum's current preservation projects is a 1993 Black Rose Corvette ZR-1—one of just 11 ZR-1s produced in this color for the 1993 model year. Its rarity alone makes it significant, but the care taken in its preservation is what ensures its legacy endures.

Mechanical Preservation Comes First

Before addressing cosmetics, the Museum's team focused on critical mechanical systems to ensure the car remains safe, functional, and historically accurate. The fuel pumps, clutch assembly, and brake system have all been replaced as part of this process. These updates are essential to maintaining the integrity of the vehicle while allowing it to be properly maintained and demonstrated in the future. Mechanical preservation is a foundational step. Without it, visual restoration alone would fall short of the Museum's standards.

Careful Body Preparation and Refinishing

With mechanical work complete, attention turned to the body. Portions of the car were disassembled to allow the team proper access for surface preparation. The finish was then hand-sanded down to primer—a labor-intensive process that ensures the surface is properly prepared and true to original specifications. The refinishing process included two coats of base color followed by two heavy coats of clear. This approach allows for depth, durability, and accuracy while respecting the original character of the Black Rose finish. The vehicle is currently in the wet sanding and buffering stage, where fine adjustments bring clarity and consistency to the final surface.

Approaching Final Assembly

Final assembly is scheduled for next week, marking the last major phase of this preservation effort. Once complete, this rare Black Rose ZR-1 will stand as a carefully preserved example of Corvette's performance heritage from the early 1990s. Projects like this reflect the Museum's long-term commitment to preserving America's Sports Car—not just as an object to admire, but as a living record of design, engineering, and history. Stay tuned as this 1993 Black Rose Corvette ZR-1 returns to full form.

Barrett-Jackson “The Price Is Right” Wrap-Up by Jeff Murphy

For the 20th consecutive year, an adventurous group of LCCC members enjoyed the annual January diversion we call “The Price Is Right”, our once a year guessing game held in conjunction with the Barrett-Jackson Collector Car Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona. The object of our contest is to correctly guess the “hammer price” of a select group of Corvettes and a few other cars that cross the stage at the auction. This special Anniversary Year saw 42 courageous members jump into the action, including six Rookies. A special shout-out to Mike and Suzanne Baker, who hosted the Saturday “Wrap-Up/Viewing Party”. Without further ado, let’s jump right into the action:

JB TPIR Day 1 – Rookies & Veterans Flex Their Muscles!!

While the uber-wealthy movers and shakers along with world leaders are gathered in Davos discussing what it’s going to take to keep us from economically and/or physically destroying one another in the next few months, another kind of craziness was happening about 5800 miles and 8 time zones to the west at WestWorld of Scottsdale as Barrett-Jackson kicked-off Day 1.

A couple of our TPIR veterans wasted no time entering the Bull’s Eye race, as Mary Anne Lewandowski and Kurt Steidle both provided perfect predictions on Lot 178, the 1965 Corvette Convertible, when it hammered at a nice round \$50,000. Predictions by Betty Marley and Tony DeFelice bracketed it by \$3000, Joan Steidle and your Gamemeister accomplished the same feat \$4000 away, and Rosemary Lafata guessed a scant \$5000 too high. While a few others managed 4-digit hits, most of our field racked-up modest 5-digit additions to their scores right out of the gate. Notice that I said “most”. Melissa Gramley started her sophomore year in our little contest with a \$315,000 hit, complements of a \$105,000 or 210% overbid, resulting in the dreaded 3X penalty. Lot 257.1, the low-mileage 1984 Coupe, was next, and left the stage with a new owner’s name on the title at \$15,000. A trio of our combatants once again nailed the hammer price, with “right on the bug’s nuts” guesses submitted by Sue Mooney, Brad Marley, and Scott Kingsboro. A plethora of near misses were led by Rookie Cork Gramley whose \$14,800 prediction was only two Ben Franklin’s away (don’t worry, he’ll eventually learn that all bids for the first couple of days are in \$500 increments). Two Sue’s (Gerhart and Baker) each missed by \$500, while Ken Unger, Rookie Gwen Gramley, and yours truly strayed by the slimmest of 4-digit margins. Our first day ended when Lot 258 hammered at a predictable and respectable \$26,000, and Brad Marley registered his second consecutive Bull’s Eye, our 6th of the evening. Rookie Robin Shilling missed by \$26 with a \$26,026 prediction (did your keyboard stick, Robin?), while Steve Witmer, Bob Lafata, and Joan Steidle all missed by a slim \$1000. Aldi and Judy again posted big 6-digit hits, only eclipsed by Melissa Gramley’s \$489,000 addition to her score on the strength (?) of her \$189,000 prediction.

After Day 1, Kurt leads the way at a minuscule \$6000 in penalties, followed by Brad Marley at \$9000, Rookie Robin Shilling at \$11,749, and fellow newcomer Joe McElwee at \$14,000. Ken and Joan are tied at \$15K, while last year’s champ Tony, perennial sharpshooter Steve, and Betty round-out the under \$20,000 crew. On the team front, Marleen’s “The Screamin’ Tires” hold a slim lead over Scott’s “Winning Rays”, with Mike Baker’s “Blind Bidders & Hopeful Hammers” in third.

All in all, an exciting and mildly craze Day 1. Tomorrow brings Day 2, aka “Rodney Dangerfield Day”. Why that name, you ask? With our field consisting of four C3’s, the generation of Corvettes that even after 40+ years still “don’t get no respect”, it seemed like the perfect moniker to slap on our docket. So sit back, maybe stream Caddyshack to get you in the mood before the action starts, and then enjoy the show.

BJ TPIR Day 2 – Caddyshack Meets Star Wars

Yesterday’s recap ended with a “tip of the hat” to one of America’s comic legends, Rodney Dangerfield, and the potential correlation between his signature tagline and our line-up of Corvettes coming up on Day 2. Not to outdone, it seems like one of the luminaries of the Star Wars franchise – everyone’s favorite protocol droid – decided to get into our game as well. Not only did our docket “get no respect” from the bidders on the auction floor, but based on the malodorous, “in the toilet” pricing that third generation Corvettes commanded throughout the entire day, C-3PO also made an appearance, but perhaps a better name for him would be C-3 PU!!

Yes, folks, prices were just plain stinky throughout the day. Low prices notwithstanding, our string of Bull’s Eyes on each car in our docket continued, and now stands at seven straight cars, with 12 total. Leading the way on our first car of the day, Lot 381, the 1981 NCRS Top Flight Coupe, was Rookie Gwen Gramley with a perfect \$17,000 prediction. Joan Steidle, Scott Kingsboro, Bob Lafata, and Jesse Landis missed by a scant \$1000, followed by Rookie Cork Gramley at \$1800 (there’s that \$200 again), and then by Ken Unger, Jan Gerhart, Kurt Steidle, Brad Marley and Travis Gramley all just \$2000 away. At the other end, Aldi and Judy King both enjoyed low six-figure hits. Lot 389, the first of our two 1969 Coupes, found reigning champion Tony DeFelice and Ruth Fox scoring our next Bull’s Eyes with very precise \$35,000 forecasts. While the vast majority of our field overbid this car by a bunch (or more), a few others were oh-so-close, including Betty and Brad Marley \$1K away, Susan Gerhart at \$1250, Clyde Mooney at \$2K, and Travis, Kelly Sylvester, Sue Mooney, Jan Gerhart, and Marleen Foreman all a slim \$3000 off course. At the other end, Melissa Gramley’s big misfire and \$198,000 addition to her score ushered her into the \$1 Million Club, and she became our Charter Member for 2026. Don’t get too cozy, Melissa – you’ll have plenty of company soon.

Our second 1969 Coupe, the 427 Tri-Power with factory A/C at Lot 429, pulled a more respectable \$70,000 hammer price, and was met with Nostradamus-like precision by Mike Baker. Cork was next at \$1100, followed by Steve Witmer, Gwen, Paul Wenger, and Craig Foreman only \$5000 off the mark. While Aldi joined Melissa in the \$1 Million Club with a \$120,000 hit, our Grand Prize for the “Holy Crap, Where Did That Guess Come From?” Award goes to Sue Baker, who’s \$428,500 estimate resulted in a \$1,075,500 penalty! With that prediction, I can only surmise that Sue believed that “Tri-Power” meant a combination of combustion, steam, and thermo-nuclear propulsion. Our afternoon ended early with Lot 432.1, the 1972 454 Coupe, with Bob and Paul BOTH hitting the \$50,000 hammer price right on the nail’s head. Sue Baker recovered nicely with a \$1000 miss, followed closely by Rookies Robin Shilling at \$1235 and Joe McElwee at \$1500. For those of you that took the time to look at everyone’s guesses, you may have noticed that Robin has taken a very unconventional approach with her predictions. All I can say is thank goodness the spreadsheet calculates everything and I don’t have to compute her scores by hand. Capping off the night Aldi took another \$255K hit to his score, resulting in a simultaneous chant from the audience in Scottsdale of “NO! KING! NO! KING!...”

After two days Brad Marley leads the way at \$80,000, followed by Sue Mooney at \$85,000, Jan Gerhart at \$94,500, Clyde Mooney at \$95,500, and Joan Steidle at \$98,000 rounding-out the under 6-figure crowd. Nine more are well poised in the low \$100,000’s. Brad continues to lead the Bull’s Eye race with 2, with 10 other competitors at 1 apiece. In our Rookie battle, Robin holds a slim \$5697 lead over Joe, so maybe there is a method to her random-number madness. On the team front, the “Winning Rays” vaulted into the lead, followed by “Cross Flag Legends”, “Staging Lane Lunatics”, and “Beauties & The Beast”.

One item omitted from yesterday’s recap was our “Beginner’s Bounty” prize. Each day, one of the vehicles is randomly selected to determine the winner among our slate of Rookies (limited to 1 “Beginner’s Bounty” per Rookie). Yesterday it was Lot 258, the Anniversary Pace Car, and Robin’s \$26,026 prediction was a scant \$26 too high. Today, it is Lot 429, the 1969 Tri-Power Coupe. With a bid \$15,000 lower than the \$70,000 hammer price, Elsie Wenger takes the prize. Both will receive \$10 when prizes are distributed.

Two days down, three to go. We should see our last “bargain day” tomorrow, featuring a broad sampling of Corvettes (2 C1’s, another C3, a C7 and a C8), before prices start their unrelenting move upward. Our leader board is pretty crowded at the top, so this contest could come down to the wire. With that in mind, don’t forget to RSVP to the Baker’s for the Saturday watch party – you won’t want to miss the fun!!

BJ TPIR Day 3 – The “Affordability Hoax” Invades Scottsdale

With some pretty sweet machinery crossing the Barrett-Jackson stage on Thursday, depressed prices and less-than-thrilled post-hammer sellers continued to be the one consistent theme of the day. This not only applied to the 5 Corvettes in our contest but also the majority of vehicles that crossed the auction block. The frequent disappointment in the auctioneer’s timber, tone, and attitude was evident throughout the afternoon and evening.

First up for us was Lot 721.1, the 1954 Pennant Red Roadster, one of only about 100 produced back when Denison, Texas’s own Dwight D. Eisenhower was enjoying his second year in office. On the good news front, Fran Cox kept our Bull’s Eye streak alive with an unbelievably precise bid of \$51,000. Out of our 41 other competitors, only 4 predicted a price lower, with the other 37 higher, way higher, and holy sh*t higher. Kudos to Bill Cox with his \$2000 miss, Kelly Sylvester \$5000 away, and Mary Anne Lewandowski rounding-out the 4-digit crowd at \$9000. 5-Digit and low 6-Digit hits were the norm for most of our field. At the far end, Joe Branco set the high-water mark with a serious overbid of \$650,000, resulting in a nearly \$1.8 million addition to his score, and thrusting him not only into the \$1 Million Club but straight through to the exclusive \$2 Million Society. Craig Foreman, wife Marleen, and Melissa Gramley also enjoyed serious 6-digit punishments, but the severity of Joe’s calamity fortunately keeps me from doing a deeper dive into their misfortune.

Lot 739.1, the 1970 NCRS Top Flight LT1 Coupe, saw our Bull’s Eye streak come to an end when nobody predicted the paltry \$64,000 hammer price. Our group’s overbids on this lot were still numerous but weren’t quite as bad as the first of the night, compliments of some bidder on the Barrett-Jackson floor who decided to forego today’s government recommended cost-saving meal of tortilla, broccoli, and piece of chicken so that he could up his bid a bit and take that fine piece of machinery home. Marvin Fox led the way with a prediction only \$1K too high, followed by Melissa Gramley \$2K too low, and a group consisting of Jim Roberts, Jan Gerhart, Betty Marley, and Autumn Kingsboro bracketing the final price only \$4K away. Joe Branco again took the biggest hit, but at only \$213,000 it was hardly even noticeable compared to the recent serious increase in his score. Lot 752, the 2022 C8.R Coupe, continued the bargain basement pricing when this pristine example found a new home for \$84,000. Mike Baker and Bob Lafata led the way with guesses a slim \$4000 too low, followed by Fran Cox at \$5K, Jim Roberts at \$8K, and Bill Cox at \$9K filling out the 4-digit misses. Sharon Roberts was a bunch too low – and Rookie Elsie Wenger and Judy King were a bunch too high – resulting in our only \$100K+ but ultimately not crazy penalties.

At least a couple of bidders finally recognized the value and rarity in Lot 796, the 1957 Fuelie when it found a new owner who wasn’t concerned about grocery prices, healthcare costs, or their electricity bill when it hammered at a conveniently simple \$150,000. In spite of the very round number, not a single member of our field managed to guess the exact price. Tony DeFelice once more demonstrated why he’s always near the top of the leader board with a guess just \$5K too high, matched by your Gamemeister who again proved that even a blind squirrel can find its nuts once in a while. At the other end, Travis Gramley led a pack of serious 6-digit penalties with a \$411,000 doink to his score, followed by Bob Lafata at an even \$300K and Bill and Fran Cox who split \$588K almost right down the middle. Our night ended with Lot 833, the 2016 Z06 Coupe that found a new owner for a nice round \$100,000. Bull’s Eyes once again escaped our field, with Ruth Fox closest at \$4000 too low, and hubby Marvin, Rookie Jim Adams, and Joan Steidle just \$1000 higher.

With three days down and two wild ones to go, Joe Branco and Aldi King are enjoying the exclusive ambiance of the \$2 Million Society, while Melissa Gramley, Sue Baker, Craig Foreman, Judy King and Rookies Elsie Wenger and Jim Adams are all putting their feet up and enjoying the comfort of the \$1 Million Club. Robin continues to hold a slim \$5509 lead over Joe in the Rookie race, and Brad Marley has a precarious grip on the Bull’s Eye lead with two. Sue Mooney has surged to the front in the overall battle at \$248,000, with Clyde the only other contestant under \$300K at \$264,500. The \$300K-\$399 range includes Joan, Jan, Mike, Kurt, Susan G, Brad, and Betty in order, while the \$400K-\$499K group includes another 11, so the battles for the top spots are far from over. In the team competition, the Winning Rays continue to outpace the Cross Flag Legends, with the Staging Lane Lunatics in 3rd. Our Rookie “Beginner’s Bounty” prize today goes to Jim Adams, who’s \$11,000 miss on Lot 752 bested the newbie field.

Friday ushers in the beginning of the “big rollers” taking over the bidding floor, where the expensive bourbon flows freely and the prices escalate right along with it. We’ve got 6 cars on the docket tomorrow, and if history is any indication, this is where our field will really begin to spread out. With 30+ year single malt out of question for most of us pedestrian competitors, your Gamemeister recommends you grab a bucket of your favorite brews, put your feet up on the ottoman or coffee table, and enjoy the action.

FYI – While many of you will be at the Baker’s enjoying Saturday’s action (weather permitting, of course), Kelly and I will be at our Las Vegas club’s Annual Awards Banquet. Accordingly, Saturday’s recap will most likely not arrive in your Inbox until sometime late Sunday morning. Of course, by then it will hardly be “Breaking News”, but realistically aren’t we all getting a little bit tired of the constant barrage of that label anyway?

BJ TPIR Day 4 – At Least Things Are Heating Up Somewhere...

While 2/3 of the country is diving into an epic deep-freeze, things were heating up in Scottsdale. Our first car of the day, Lot 995.1, the '65 L84 Corvette Coupe, was met with two Bull's Eyes when Judy King (her 1st) and Paul Wenger (his 2nd) perfectly predicted the \$125,000 hammer price. Slim misses were few and far between, with Marvin and Ruth Fox along with Rookie Elsie Wenger only \$5000 off, followed by Joan Steidle at \$7000. At the other end, Bob Lafata with a guess seriously too low, and Rookies Cork and Gwen Gramley with guesses seriously too high, each added a little over two hundred grand to their scores.

Lot 1047, the 1967 L36 Corvette Coupe with factory A/C, saw Autumn Kingsboro jump into the Bull's Eye battle with a matching \$125,000 forecast. A handful of competitors were a scant \$5K off, including Steve Witmer and Ken Unger, Elsie and Marvin, and yours truly. Six-digit hits were relatively few, led by Sharon Roberts and Bill Cox, who both managed \$240,000 additions to their score, and simultaneously ushered themselves into the \$1 Million Club. In retrospect, these first two cars must have had some kind of supernatural membership curse associated with them, because even minor infractions found many of our players learning the secret password and unlocking the front door – including Marleen Foreman, Fran Cox, Bob, Cork, and Gwen. After a long pause in the action, the 1960 Fuelie at Lot 1116 crossed the auction block and was met with two more Bull's Eyes by Kelly Sylvester and Marleen Foreman when it exited stage right at \$120,000. \$5K misses were plentiful once again, with Elsie, Kurt and Joan Steidle, Sue Mooney, and your Gamemeister racking-up those minor infractions. Rookie Jim Adams, Bob, and Tony DeFelice enjoyed (?) the only 6-digit hits starting with a “2”. Sue Mooney's perfect \$115,000 prediction on Lot 1133, the VIN 001 2023 70th Anniversary Coupe, her 2nd precise estimate of the contest, brought her into a 3-way tie for the Bull's Eye lead with Brad Marley and Paul Wenger. Husband Clyde was a slim \$3000 too high, followed by Susan Gerhart, Marleen, and Tony, who rebounded nicely from the previous misfire. The same can't be said for a few of our other competitors, who sustained some serious 6-digit injuries to their score. Cork led the way at \$435,000, followed by Sue Baker at \$405K, Sue's hubby Mike at \$390K, and Gwen at \$375K. I'm not sure a simple Band-Aid will stop the bleeding...

Before the next Lot arrived at the stage, either the big roller bidders got hungry and left for The Capital Grille, or the alcohol stopped flowing when drink servers on the auction floor scattered as rumors of ICE vehicles being spotted outside began to circulate, because at this point of the evening prices dropped like a stone. Lot 1146.1, the 1956 NCRS Duntov Award Winner broke our

Bull’s Eye streak when nobody predicted the paltry \$83,000 price. In fact, only 5 of our 42 contestants predicted a lower price. Closest was Scott Kingsboro at \$2000 over, followed by

Sharon Roberts \$3000 over and Brad Marley another \$4000 higher. High 5- and low 6-digit additions were the soup du jour, with the notable exception of Mary Anne Lewandowski ringing-up a \$501,000 hit to her total (and yes, this resulted in her learning the password and secret handshake too). A similar nearly field-wide overbid awaited our last car of the evening, Lot 1160.1, the 1970 LT1 Convertible, with one notable exception – Susan Gerhart racked-up her 1st Bull’s Eye

with a perfect \$57,000 prediction. Others under suspicion of possibly starting that nasty ICE rumor to force the big bidders to search for liquor elsewhere include Rookies Joe McElwee (\$1000) and Robin Shilling (\$2213), Ken Unger (\$3000), and Jan Gerhart (\$4000), each of them only a little too high. At the other end, Tony and Jim once again had serious static interrupt communication with the future in their crystal balls, adding \$354K to their scores, followed by Joe Branco at

\$339,000.

As Day 4 comes to a close, our attention now turns to the “Grand Total” line, which includes everyone’s “Get Out Of Jail Free” Deduction. If you’re new to this game, you’ll understand fully by the end of Saturday. Leading the way with a microscopically small total of \$254,000 is Sue

Mooney, followed by Jan Gerhart at \$343,500, and Clyde at \$368,500. Our \$400K-\$500K group includes Joan Steidle (\$420,000), Kurt (\$424,000), Mike Baker (\$436,000), Susan Gerhart (\$473,300), and Ruth Fox (\$475,000). The \$5XX,XXX group includes 6 more, and the \$6XX,XXX bunch includes an additional 8. As noted above, the Bull’s Eye race is still wide open with Sue, Brad, and Paul tied with two apiece, while 14 others have notched a single direct shot. In the Rookie race Joe has slipped in front of Robin by \$3187, but nobody’s really out of it yet with Saturday’s insanity yet to unfold. Our Rookie “Beginner’s Bounty” prize today goes to Joe McElwee, who’s \$23,000 miss on Lot 1116 was closest of the Rookies who had still not won. On the Team front, it’s still wide open.

The “Winning Rays” hold a slim \$12,990 lead over the “Staging Lane Lunatics”, with the “Cross Flag Legends” nipping at their heels. Maybe with one or two exceptions, each team is still alive in this race.

Saturday, along with the bitter cold in Lancaster, is upon us. At least on my weather App it looks like the snow should hold off until after the final gavel falls, so the wrap-up party should be a “go” (look for more info from Mike & Sue). Eight Corvettes, three of them “customs” – always a challenge and sometimes destined to discombobulate the leader board – to test your prognosticating prowess along with your medication’s ability to moderate your blood pressure. For those out of the running for a podium finish, four “Bonus Cars” for everyone to battle over. The “big dogs” have officially arrived in Scottsdale, and the wannabe’s from the first few days have been moved to the cheap seats. As 20 years of this craziness has shown us time and time again, buckle-up buttercup, things are going to get wild!

BJ TPIR Day 5 – Let Them Eat Cake!

Day 5 at Barrett-Jackson certainly lived up to its well-deserved reputation – people with way too much money, drinking way too much expensive alcohol, letting way too much testosterone flow through their veins, and ultimately bidding and spending way more than most of us can even comprehend. The result of this insanity was a TPIR leader board that bounced back and forth more than a southern Nevada jackrabbit on cocaine. Accordingly, in addition to the normal commentary, after each Lot I will recap the top 5 contestants so that everyone can follow along... As a reminder, here’s where things stood for the Top 5 after Day 4: 1) Sue Mooney at \$254K, 2) Jan Gerhart at \$343.5K, 3) Clyde Mooney at \$368.5K, 4) Joan Steidle at \$420K, and 5) Kurt Steidle at \$424K.

First up was Lot 1297.1, the 1967 L71 NCRS Duntov Award Coupe. Proving once again that way too often originality ain’t worth what it once was, the \$117,000 hammer price seemed like quite the bargain compared to similarly spec’d Corvettes in other recent auctions. Fran Cox and Autumn Kingsboro were closest at \$3000 off, followed by Jan Gerhart at \$4000 and both Jim and Sharon Roberts another \$3K away. While there were a handful of mid six-figure hits, Rookie Jim Adams outdistanced the entire field with a \$1,074,000 addition to his total. New Top 5: 1) Jan \$347.5K, 2) Sue M \$356K, 3) Joan \$438K, 4) Kurt \$447K, 5) Mike Baker \$449K.

Lot 1300 followed shortly after, and the 2019 ZR1 Convertible found a happy new owner at \$155,000. Kurt Steidle at \$5000 and Betty Marley at \$7000 had our lone 4-digit misses. 6-digit penalties were plentiful, with the leading-digit “3” crowd led by Jim at \$390,000, Rosemary Lafata at \$345,000, and Clyde Mooney at an even \$300,000. New Top 5: 1) Joan \$448K, 2) Kurt \$452K, 3) Jan \$457.5K, 4) Mike \$484K, 5) Sue M \$641K.

As our first custom crossed the auction block, things started to get stupid. Lot 1360, the beautiful bright yellowish-gold with white coves 1960 hammered at \$485,000. Clyde at \$10,000 too low and Sue at \$60,000 had our field’s ONLY 5-digit misses. With 19 of our competitors registering 7-digit, \$1 Million+ misses, I’ll refrain from calling anyone out by name and simply request witness protection status for the entire lot. New Top 5: 1) Kurt \$560K, 2) Joan \$562K, 3) Jan \$619.5K, 4) Sue M \$701K, 5) Susan Gerhart \$760.8K.

Lot 1373, the 1963 Split Window Custom Wide-Body Coupe was next and found a new oak barrel-aged single malt-infused owner at \$460,000. Mike Baker’s \$10K miss led our field, followed by Sue M, Ken Unger, and Rookie Cork Gramley at \$40K, Clyde at \$65K, and Rookie Gwen Gramley at \$80K completing our 5-digit heroes. This time only 5 of our competitors cracked the \$1 Million mark, led by Rosemary Lafata at \$1,245,000. New Top 5: 1) Sue M \$741K, 2) Kurt \$830K, 3) Joan \$832K, 4) Mike at \$844K, and 5) Clyde \$863.4K, the latter two both back into the Top 5.

Did I say things got stupid on Lot 1360? You ain’t seen stupid yet. Lot 1379, the 1963 NCRS Top Flight “Big Tank” 1963 Split Window Z06 brought the insanely high bid of \$1 Million!! Based on quick research, that’s about DOUBLE any previous sale for that type of vehicle. I can only conclude that based on that price, they omitted “An urn of Zora Arkus Duntov’s ashes is included in the glovebox” from the vehicle’s description. That literary oversight notwithstanding, kudos to Tony DeFelice leading our small group of 6-digit misses at an even \$100,000, followed by Kurt at \$150,000, Rookie Jim Adams at \$175,000, Joan at \$250,000, Jan at \$520,000, Susan G at \$660,000, Mike at \$750,000, Marleen Foreman at \$850,000, Cork at \$880,000, and finally Steve Witmer at \$900K. Everybody else? Bend over and smile. New Top 5: 1) Kurt \$980K, 2) Sue M \$1,065K, 3) Joan \$1,082K, 4) Clyde \$1,163.5K, and 5) Mike \$1,234K.

Our final custom, the other 1960 Restomod at Lot 1416, garnered an even \$400,000 when the gavel fell. Surprisingly, nobody guessed that nice round number and our Bull’s Eye board remained unmolested for the day. Kelly Sylvester led a small group of 5-digit misses with a guess just \$25,000 too high, followed by Kurt at \$50,000, Jan at \$73,000, Joan at \$75,000, and a group at \$80,000 including Jesse Landis, Sue M, and your humbled Gamemeister. New Top 5: 1) Kurt \$1,030 (relinquishing his grip on being the last non-\$1 Million Club holdout), 2) Sue M \$1,145K, 3) Joan \$1,157K, 4) Clyde \$1,263.5K, and 5) Mike \$1,534K.

Lot 1427.1, the first of two 1963 Split Window Coupes to close our show, crossed the stage and this red NCRS Top Flight Award Winner found a new 0.1%-er affix his name to the title at \$270,000.

Five of our contestants missed adding to their Bull’s Eye totals by a slim \$5000 – Mary Anne Lewandowski, Brad and Betty Marley, Judy King, and Joe Branco. Nobody registered a 7-digit hit, but Rookie Jim Adams tried his best by racking-up a \$990,000 addition to his score. New Top 5: 1) Sue M \$1,155K, 2) Kurt \$1,240K, 3) Clyde \$1,288.5K, 4) Joan \$1,317K, and 5) Mike \$1,584K.

With the Top 5 flipping back and forth like a teenager scrolling through Tik Tok, our final car of the contest would ultimately determine the winner. Lot 1443.1, the black L84 Split Window Coupe hammered at \$194,000, with Ken Unger and Susan Gerhart missing by the slimmest of \$1000 margins. Jim Roberts finished strong with a \$3000 miss, and Ruth Fox was close behind at \$4000. Some serious 6-digit and one 7-digit penalties closed out our contest and ultimately impacted the final results. When the dust finally settled and the electronic bits in the spreadsheet came to rest, the final Top 5 looked like this: 1) Sue M \$1,317,000, 2) Kurt \$1,620,000, 3) Joan \$1,637,000, 4) Jesse Landis \$1,736,000, and 5) Mike \$1,756,000.



