Hi! I'm Steve Witmer!

74 years young. I am the father of 2 children, Amy (Ben) 2 Grand Kids - Alex and Isabelle. Joe is my son, not married. My Jack Russell Cooper is 12. My wife Monica passed away in 2011 followed by a daughter Michelle a few years after that. Former executive chef at the Host Town. I retired after 25 years at the Hershey Medical Center in food service the fall of 2011. I started a lawn and landscape business (2 men mowing) in the spring of 2011 till current. I have several other current gigs.

I clean offices in downtown Lancaster 2 nights a week (25 years), PIAA track and field official (26 years), umpire mostly adult men (9 years). I have a lot of interests like NASCAR and most sports. I worked as a volunteer in the NASCAR garage feeding teams for over 15 years, up to 16 weekends a year till COVID.



My story began in 1969 the year I graduated from Manheim Township HS. I was allowed to drive my friends 1965 Torch Red corvette alone a few times and I and the car survived. That summer I picked up a 1965 Mustang 289 and survived that. Unfortunately an acquaintance of mine borrowed it one day and wrecked it running away from police on New Danville pike. After repairs it was never the same. Traded it in for a VW square back and family life. Unfortunately, for a long time I always thought I could not afford a true sports car. A Toyota Celica was as close as I came. I joined the Saturn no haggle purchase plan when they came on the market and have had several. My wife contracting Leukemia and a life saving bone marrow transplant survived for 14 years and prednisone induced hip replacement kept me from purchasing a Saturn Sky due to her inability to enter and exit that type of vehicle. I bought a Saturn quad instead and eventually a Vue for her. In 2019 I saw an advertisement for a 2002 Torch Red corvette coupe. After seeing this for several weeks I looked on line what it looked like and I liked the style. My bank account persuaded me to check it out and I purchased it. About a week after purchasing this beauty it dawned on me I could join the coveted LCCC. I made the call to Clyde and he explained what to do and I joined in mid October. I missed the rained out Faulkner car show and Angels experience by one week thank goodness because that would have been a real damper.

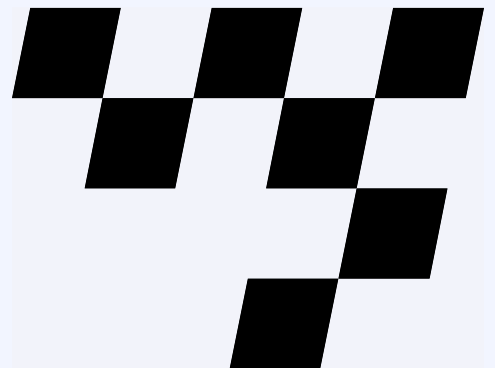
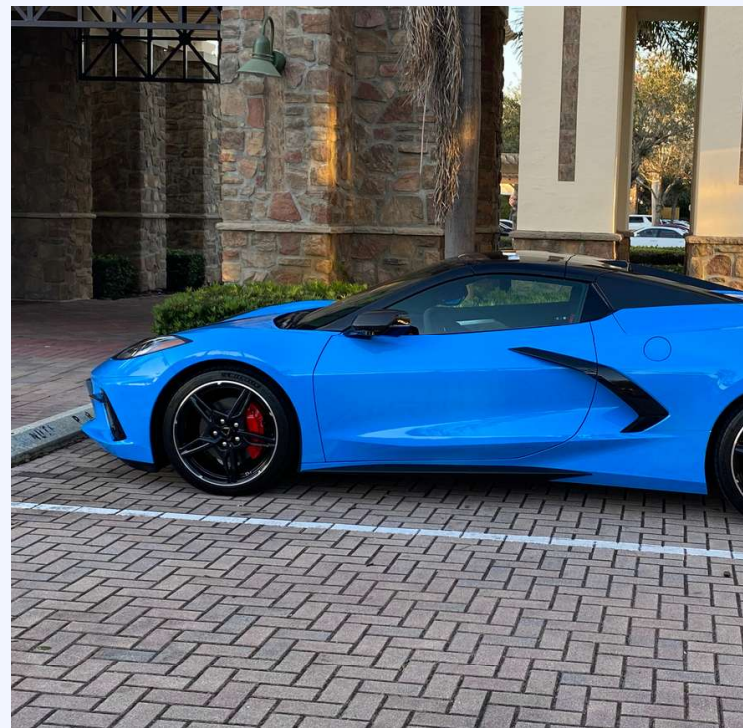

I was in a Harrisburg Holiday parade in December. I had a lot of time to talk to Aldie King waiting for our division while the convertibles drove the WGAL dignitaries around early in that parade. After our conversation I realized convertibles were way more desirable for parades. I sold my coupe after a year or so and didn't have a corvette for months. Then COVID came and the market dried up. When Whitmoyer finally called and Eric Koser said he had a 2015 gray convertible, I jumped on it. Not entirely satisfied with that gray ghost a couple of years later early in January 2024 I saw their advertisement for a Torch Red 2017 Grand Sport. I had a feeling when I saw that car my bank account would take another hit. I was right! I looked at it January 2nd, and didn't even take a test drive. I went through the negotiations with Matt Beaver and we reached an agreement. On January 3rd I took possession and drove home in a thunderstorm with my top unsecured. An L3 I still don't know all this cars capability.

As most members know I am the PARADER and I will do every parade we sponsor if I am available including 4 in 3 days over the Memorial weekend. I enjoy our family, our social events, car shows, parades and I really appreciate everyone accepting me for all my quirks.

Newsletter Report - Terri Hollis was unable to attend this evening.

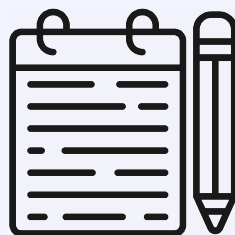

Corvette ZR1X Delivered at the National Corvette Museum

A new era of Corvette has officially arrived on Corvette Boulevard. Today, the first 2026 Corvette ZR1X was delivered through the National Corvette Museum's R8C Delivery Program, marking a milestone moment for America's Sports Car and for the evolution of high-performance engineering.

The ZR1X represents a defining step forward in the Corvette legacy. Built on a hybrid architecture that combines a 5.5L twin-turbo LT7 V8 with an electric motor, it produces an astonishing 1,250 horsepower delivered through an advanced all-wheel-drive system. The result is capability that places Corvette firmly in hypercar territory, with acceleration to 60 mph in under 2 seconds, a top speed exceeding 230 mph, and quarter-mile times in the 8-second range.

Every element of the ZR1X is engineered with purpose. Extensive carbon fiber integration enhances strength while reducing weight, and the largest braking system ever fitted to a Corvette ensures confidence at every speed. This is a machine designed not only to push boundaries, but to redefine them.

Finished in Blade Silver Metallic, this ZR1X made its arrival in the place where Corvette's story is preserved and celebrated every day. From its first moments on Corvette Boulevard, it became part of a larger legacy that spans more than seven decades of innovation, design, and performance.

The R8C Delivery Program continues to offer Corvette owners a unique opportunity to begin their journey at the Museum, where Adrenaline Meets Tradition®. Each delivery connects the excitement of taking ownership with the history that defines America's Sports Car.
