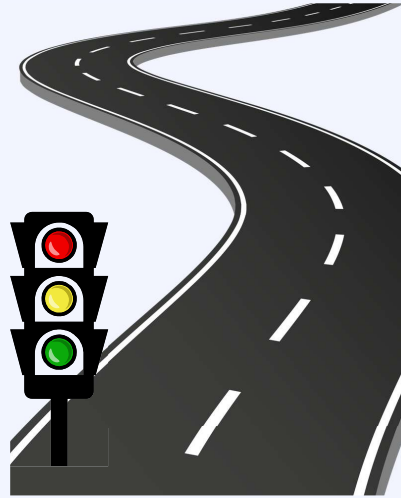

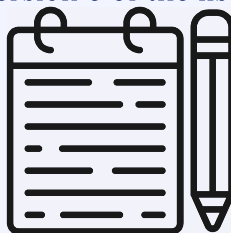

The 2026 Raffle Car has been acquired from Ciocca Corvette by Lance Miller. This year the car is well appointed with some notable options including the Front Lift Adjustable Height, GT2 Bucket Seats, 20-Spoke Forged Aluminum Gloss Black Wheels, Sueded Microfiber-Wrapped Steering Wheel, and Low Rear Spoiler and Front Splitter. It is again a 2LT Coupe and it has a jet black interior. You can start talking it up and getting ready to sell all 1000 tickets again this year.

For those who are new to the club, we have the good fortune to run the operations of this annual raffle on behalf of the Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation. All the proceeds go directly to our two charities, the Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation and The Clare House. Remember, this is not our raffle, we just run it for the Miller organization with the help of The Clare House staff. For that work, they are gracious enough to give half the proceeds to our charity, The Clare House. Our club does not keep any of the funds. This event raises the most money by far for our charities and it takes a lot of help to make it successful each year.

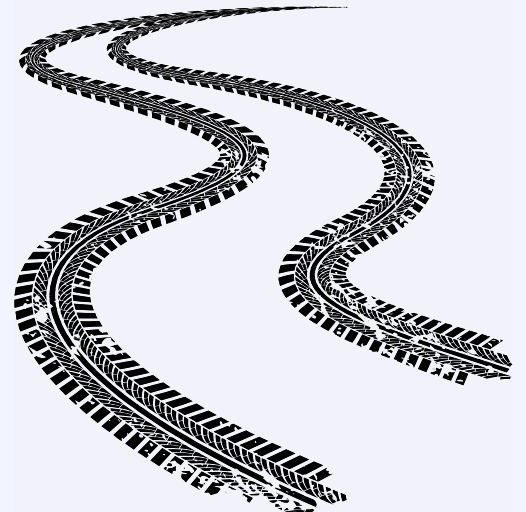
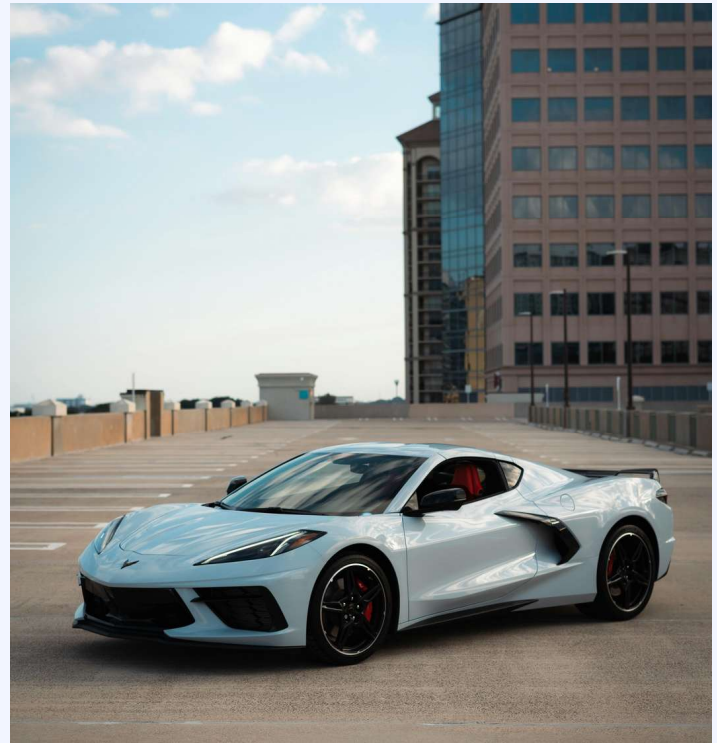
We sell in three main ways, 1) Individual sales, 2) through the mail, 3) at shows—the biggest being the Corvettes at Carlisle Show. We ask each member of the club to sell or buy tickets. If each member buys 1 and sells 1, we would reach 20% of our goal. Because we are well known for this raffle, customers seek us out to get their tickets. However, since we are not sure what the weather will be like at our last and biggest event, we need to sell as many as we can before that Corvettes at Carlisle weekend. Lisa and I will have a lot more information as things progress. For now, here are things to remember:

- Tickets are \$150 each*
 - The drawing to determine the winner is the 7PM drawing of the PA Pick 3 on Saturday August 29, 2026.*
 - We need EVERYONE to help buy or sell tickets.*
 - Sign-up sheets are going around at our General Meeting for the 3 events where we need help: the envelope stuffing, the GM Nationals selling, and the Corvettes at Carlisle selling.*
- There are multiple opportunities to help, just let Lisa and I know how you want to be involved.*

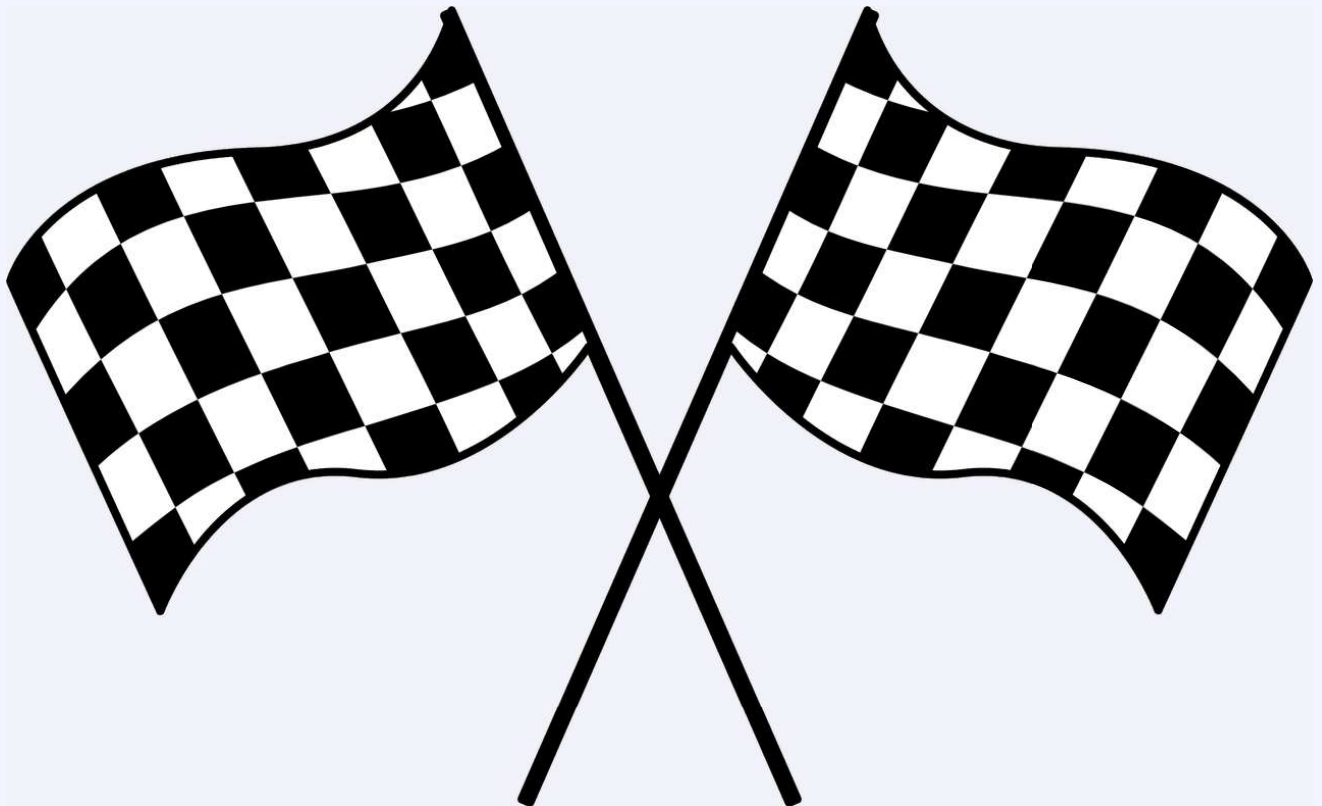

Secretary's Report - The secretary's report for the May General meeting was received, and no updates or corrections were necessary.

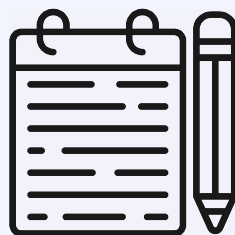
Treasurer's Report - The Treasurer's report for May was reviewed by Sharon Roberts

Michael Jordan's 1993 Corvette ZR-1 Joins the National Corvette Museum



A Ruby Red 40th Anniversary Corvette ZR-1 once owned by NBA legend Michael Jordan is now on exhibition at the National Corvette Museum as part of Pop Culture and Corvette: An American Love Affair .

Widely recognized as one of the greatest basketball players of all time, Jordan helped redefine professional sports during the 1990s while leading the Chicago Bulls to six NBA championships in eight seasons. His impact extended far beyond basketball, influencing fashion, entertainment, and American culture. Now, one of his most recognizable Corvettes has arrived at the Museum, where guests can experience another chapter in the legacy of America's Sports Car.

Seen in ESPN's The Last Dance

Jordan's former Corvette gained renewed attention in ESPN's acclaimed 2020 documentary series The Last Dance , which chronicled the rise of Michael Jordan and the Chicago Bulls dynasty. In episode eight, viewers see Jordan stepping out of this exact Ruby Red Corvette ZR-1 following his famous "I'm back" announcement during his return to basketball.

That moment cemented the car as more than just a high-performance Corvette. It became part of one of the most recognizable stories in modern sports history.

Michael Jordan's 1993 Corvette ZR-1 Joins the National Corvette Museum (continued)



A Corvette Built for Peak Performance

Jordan's 1993 Corvette ZR-1 represents the pinnacle of Corvette performance during the C4 era. Equipped with the legendary LT5 engine developed in partnership with Lotus Engineering, the 1993 model year saw horsepower increase from 375 to an impressive 405 horsepower, surpassing General Motors' original 400-horsepower target.

This example also features the coveted 40th Anniversary Package, offered as RPO Z25 for 1993 Corvette models. The package includes distinctive Ruby Red paint, matching Ruby Red sport seats, and Ruby Red wheel center badges, creating one of the most visually striking ZR-1s of its generation.

Today, the car stands as both a performance milestone and a cultural artifact that reflects Corvette's influence far beyond the automotive world.

Now on Exhibition in the Skydome

The Michael Jordan Corvette ZR-1 is now featured in Pop Culture and Corvette: An American Love Affair , an immersive exhibition exploring Corvette's role across film, television, music, video games, celebrity culture, and American storytelling.

Located in the Museum's iconic Skydome, the exhibition showcases more than a dozen legendary Corvettes connected to entertainment, music, sports, and popular culture. Guests can also experience nearly a half-dozen Corvette ZR1 models spanning multiple generations, highlighting the continued evolution of Corvette performance.

The vehicle is on loan to the National Corvette Museum and will remain on exhibition through Spring 2027. The Jordan ZR-1 is included with regular Museum admission.
